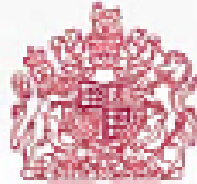

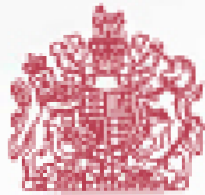

I commend the new look and expanded content of the publication that has emerged in recent years and thank the many contributors from across The Royal Regiment whose labours have produced such a thorough depiction of the myriad operational, training, sporting, social, family, historical and heritage activities and events undertaken, conducted or experienced by we Gunners in 2015. I am pleased to offer a few notes and observations of my own on what has been a typically active year for The Regt.

As Colonel Commandant, I am honoured, to convey Loyal Greetings to our Captain General on St Barbara's Day and on Artillery Day to which Her Majesty always graciously replies with words of appreciation and encouragement. This year, I expressed an additional Loyal Greeting, on September 8th, in acknowledgement of the singularity of the longevity of Her Majesty's reign.

Another privilege is to help represent The Regt to the other arms and services and so it was that in February I joined the other combat arms Colonels Commandant for our annual joint meeting with the Army Commander followed by attendance, with executives of the RCAA, at the Conference of Defence Associations Annual Meeting.

The opportunity to welcome new members to the Gunner Family is especially gratifying. In Petawawa, in March, I presented cap badges to the proud graduates of an exported DP 1 course conducted to a high standard by D Bty 2 RCHA while in July and August I was able to help do the same for newly qualified reserve Gunners in Meaford and Shilo. Similarly, I attended DP 1.2 Troop Commander graduation parades at the RCAS in April and December. In all instances, not only are congratulations due the course members for surmounting the challenges put before them but also, gratitude is owed their instructors for

Mot du Colonel Commandant

Depuis 1965, l'Artillerie canadienne a fourni une valeur inestimable à la vie et au service de l'ARC. Je tiens à souligner le nouveau look et le contenu plus étendu des publications qui ont émergé au cours des dernières années et je remercie les nombreux contributeurs de l'ensemble du Régiment royal dont le travail a donné une description complète de la multitude d'activités et d'événements opérationnels, d'entraînement, sportifs, sociaux, familiaux, historiques et patrimoniaux entrepris, organisés ou vécus par nous, les artilleurs, en 2015. Je suis heureux d'offrir quelques notes et observations sur ce qu'a été une année habituellement active pour le Régnt.

En tant que colonel commandant, j'ai l'honneur de présenter les souhaits loyaux à notre capitaine-général le jour de la Sainte-Barbe et à la fête de l'Artillerie, auxquels Sa Majesté répond toujours gentiment avec des mots d'appréciation et d'encouragement. Cette année, j'ai présenté un souhait loyal additionnel, le 8 septembre, en reconnaissance du caractère singulier de la longévité du règne de Sa Majesté.

Un autre privilège est d'aider à représenter le Régnt aux autres armes et services, et en février, je me suis donc joint aux autres colonels commandants des armes de combat pour notre rencontre annuelle interarmées avec le commandant de l'Armée, suivie de la participation, avec les directeurs de l'AARC, à la réunion annuelle de la Conférence des associations de la défense.

L'occasion d'accueillir de nouveaux membres dans la famille de l'artillerie est particulièrement gratifiante. À Petawawa, en mars, j'ai remis des insignes de coiffures aux fiers diplômés d'un cours de PP1 exporté, donné à un niveau élevé par la Bie D du 2 RCHA, tandis qu'en juillet et août, j'ai été en mesure de faire la même chose pour des artilleurs nouvellement qualifiés de la Réserve à Meaford et à Shilo. J'ai aussi participé à la parade de graduation du PP 1.2 Commandant de troupe à l'EARC, en avril et en décembre. Dans tous les cas, non seulement les stagiaires



their commitment to the upholding of regimental standards and to the success of those under their tutelage.

In August, I had two further occasions to visit reserve summer training – 3 Division's Ex WESTERN GUNNER in Shilo and 4 Division's Ex STALWART GUARDIAN in Petawawa. In both instances, the support provided by 1 RCHA and 2 RCHA was impressive in both quality and quantity and speaks, I believe, to the very robust and mutually respectful relationship that exists between the reserve and regular components of The Royal Regiment.

This year's JOC held at the Home Station saw some 58 recently commissioned officers, or newly posted in specialist officers, come together to enhance their knowledge of the history and traditions of The Royal Regiment and to learn from the experiences and current employment of some of our most distinguished past and present senior leaders. A highlight was a quite superb Special Guest Night held in the RCA Officers' Mess during which the course turned in one of the finest performances of "Screw Guns", I have ever heard!

Changes of command or appointment are always seminal events in the life of a unit and as such, I was pleased this year to be present for several including those at 5e RALC, 2nd Fd, 3rd Fd, 6e RAC, 7th Toronto, 11th Fd, 20th Fd and 49th Fd Artillery Regts and also the RCAS. The words offered by the incumbents on departure and by their successors on assumption of their appointment spoke to a uniformly outstanding sense of loyalty and commitment to the well-being of their unit.

2015 also saw changes in key appointments at the head of The Royal Regiment. In June, Col Dan Bouchard handed over the position of Regimental Colonel to Col Tim Young while CWO (Mr Gnr) Robert Beaudry assumed the post of RSM RCA from CWO Chris Rusk upon the retirement of the latter following over 35 years of most distinguished service. We owe a large debt of gratitude to these fine Gunners for their willingness to serve The Regt in addition to the heavy demands of their primary duty.

We have, of course, marked many retirements during the course of 2015 to include those of Capt Chris Barth, Regimental Adjut and MWO Cal Gibson, RHQ RCA SM. I know these gentlemen to have made an exceptional contribution to the revitalization of RHQ RCA during their tenures and I would like to use this opportunity to record that fact for posterity.

The firing of a last round is a most appropriate artillery distinction accorded Gunners of long and accomplished service. LGens (Ret'd) Mike Jeffery and Stu Beare did so this year and I was delighted to be present for the event in Shilo and in Petawawa.

Sadly, each year sees the passing of many a Gunner and I would like here to express my appreciation to all those who help share the sad news with comrades and who reach out to the families in trying times.

Gunner reunions are much happier events and this year's bi-annual gathering at the Home Station was no exception. Kudos are due the organisers and I hope that this and similar regional reunions continue to grow in attendance.

The 130th annual meeting, in Ottawa, on September 11th-12th, of the RCAA, 138 years after its founding in 1876, reminded me and all in attendance that the RCAA is indeed a venerable institution, that from the earliest years of the confederation has faithfully promoted "the efficiency and welfare of the RCA and other matters pertaining to the defence of Canada".

This year's associated training seminar, built on the success of last year's in St Jean-sur-Richelieu which was aimed at analysing our past and present with a view to taking responsibility for our future, saw us make further substantial progress toward the creation of a compelling strategic capability narrative and a

En août, j'ai eu deux autres occasions de visiter l'instruction estivale de la réserve – l'Ex WESTERN GUNNER de la 3e Division du Canada à Shilo et l'Ex STALWART GUARDIAN de la 4e Division du Canada à Petawawa. Dans les deux cas, le soutien fourni par le 1 RCHA et 2 RCHA était impressionnant, tant au niveau de la qualité que de la quantité, et il témoigne, je crois, du lien robuste et mutuellement respectueux qui existe entre les composantes de la Réserve et de la Force régulière du Régiment royal.

Le COI de cette année, qui avait lieu à la maison mère, a permis à 58 nouveaux officiers, ou des officiers spécialistes nouvellement affectés, à se rassembler pour améliorer leurs connaissances de l'histoire et des traditions du Régiment royal et pour apprendre des expériences et des emplois actuels de certains de nos plus distingués hauts dirigeants, actuels et passés. Un fait marquant a été la plutôt superbe soirée avec invité spécial qui a eu lieu au mess des officiers de l'ARC, pendant laquelle l'un des services s'est transformé en une des meilleures performances de « Screw Guns » que j'ai pu entendre!

Les changements de commandement ou les nominations sont toujours des événements marquants dans la vie d'une unité et à cette fin, j'ai eu la chance d'être présent pour plusieurs, y compris au 5 RALC, 2 RAC, 3 RAC, 6 RAC, 7e Rég Toronto, 11 RAC, 20 RAC et 49 RAC et également l'EARC. Les discours des titulaires sortants et leur successeur à leur entrée en fonction parlaient d'un remarquable sens de loyauté et d'engagement pour le bien-être de leur unité.

En 2015, on a également pu observer des changements de nominations clés à la tête du Régiment royal. En juin, le Col Dan Bouchard a remis le poste de colonel régimentaire au Col Tim Young tandis que l'Adjuc (M artil) Robert Beaudry a assumé le poste de SMR ARC pour remplacer l'Adjuc Chris Rusk, qui a pris sa retraite après plus de 35 ans de service distingué. Nous avons une gratitude infinie à l'égard de ces artilleurs remarquables pour leur volonté de servir le régiment, en plus des exigences considérables de leur fonction principale.

Bien sûr, nous avons souligné de nombreuses retraites en 2015, y compris celle du Capt Chris Barth, capt-adjt régimentaire, et l'Adjuc Cal Gibson, SM QGR ARC. Je sais qu'ils ont contribué de façon exceptionnelle à la revitalisation du QGR ARC pendant leur mandat et j'aimerais profiter de l'occasion d'enregistrer ce fait pour la postérité.

Le tir du dernier coup est la distinction la plus appropriée accordée aux artilleurs qui ont accompli un long service. Le Lgén (à la retraite) Mike Jeffery et le Lgén Stu Beare l'ont fait cette année et j'étais ravi d'être présent pour l'événement à Shilo et à Petawawa.

Malheureusement, chaque année, des artilleurs décèdent et j'aimerais exprimer ma gratitude envers tous ceux qui aident à partager la triste nouvelle avec les camarades et qui contactent les familles dans ces moments difficiles.

Les réunions d'artilleurs sont des événements beaucoup plus heureux et le rassemblement biannuel de cette année à la maison mère n'y faisait pas exception. Félicitations aux organisateurs et j'espère que la participation à cette réunion et à d'autres réunions régionales semblables continuera d'augmenter.

La 130e réunion annuelle de l'AARC, qui a eu lieu à Ottawa les 11 et 12 septembre, 138 ans après sa création en 1876, nous a rappelé, à toutes les personnes présentes et moi-même, que l'AARC est en effet une institution vénérable, qui, depuis les premières années de la confédération, a fidèlement fait la promotion de « l'efficacité et du bien-être de l'ARC et des questions relatives

unified, family wide information network. Both of these are essential tools to help assure the continuing relevance and credibility of The Royal Regiment.

Of course, the weekend of May 2nd-3rd was one of the most notable in the recent life of The Royal Regiment as we, and our comrades from the Royal Canadian Medical Service, gathered in Ottawa to honour LCol John McCrae – Gunner, Physician and Poet – and to unveil a statue in his memory adjacent to the National Artillery Memorial. This project was a great success which allowed us to illuminate McCrae's standing in the history of our Regt and in the assembly of eminent Gunners. Gratitude is due to so many from across the Regimental Family who contributed to the realization of our aspiration in ways great and small. I would here mention by name three whose contributions of inspiration, leadership and labour were unsurpassed: LCol (Ret'd) Mike McKay, MGen (Ret'd) John Arch MacInnis and LGen (Ret'd) Mike Jeffery. The Royal Regiment is truly in their debt.

The presence of the McCrae statue added poignancy to this year's Remembrance Day ceremony at the National Artillery Memorial. 30th Fd Regt did a fine job of organizing this event just as they do when called-upon to fire gun salutes, as they frequently are, on days of national import in the Capital.

Saint Barbara's Day was celebrated in fine form from Victoria to Halifax and I was fortunate to attend two observances which were denoted by a most commendable and enjoyable coming together of Gunners – in Gagetown on December 4th with 4th Artillery Regt (GS) and the RCAS and the next day, in Shawinigan, with all the Gunner Regts of the 2nd Canadian Division.

In closing, I would like to draw to the attention of the Regt two remarkable contributions to the preservation of our history and heritage made in the second half of the year.

The first was the magnificent restoration of a First World War Ordnance BL 6 Inch Howitzer for presentation to 3rd Fd Regt (The Loyal Company) RCA and The Loyal Company Association. This project was initiated and funded by HCol John Irving and was completed under the technical leadership of CWO (Mr Gnr) (Ret'd) Joe Jordan and the craftsmen of Source Atlantic Limited in Saint John. It constitutes a notably fitting commemoration of the service of New Brunswick Gunners down the years.

The second was a gift of \$100,000 by Col (Ret'd) A. Britton Smith MC, CD, QC to the RCA Regimental Fund for use in advancing the projects of the Regimental Heritage Programme. Col Smith has been a long time benefactor of The Regt as well as other worthy causes in his hometown of Kingston. A member of Canada's greatest generation, his exploits as a FOO during the Battle of Normandy in 1944 won him a Military Cross. Just as we find inspiration in Brit's courageous actions of 71 years ago, we find a model of commitment to the well-being of Regt, community and country in his actions of today. His example motivates us all to redouble our efforts to ensure that our service as members of The Royal Regiment produces results that are worthy of our hire and that his confidence in us is well-placed.

Le séminaire de formation connexe de cette année, s'appuyant sur le succès de celui de l'an dernier à St-Jean-sur-Richelieu, qui visait à analyser notre passé et le présent afin d'assumer les responsabilités pour notre avenir, nous a permis de réaliser encore des progrès importants vers la création d'un exposé des capacités stratégiques convaincantes et un réseau d'information unifié dans l'ensemble de la famille. Il s'agit de deux outils essentiels pour aider à assurer la pertinence et crédibilité continue du Régiment royal.

Bien sûr, la fin de semaine du 2-3 mai a marqué l'un des événements les plus notables de la vie récente du Régiment royal tandis que nous nous sommes rassemblés, avec nos camarades du Service de santé royal canadien, à Ottawa pour honorer le Lcol John McCrae – artilleur, médecin et poète – et pour dévoiler une statue en sa mémoire tout près du Monument national aux artilleurs. Ce projet a été un franc succès qui nous a permis d'éclairer le rôle de McCrae dans l'histoire de notre régiment et parmi l'ensemble d'éminents artilleurs. Nous remercions également toutes les personnes de la famille régimentaire qui ont contribué à la réalisation de notre aspiration par de grands et petits gestes. J'aimerais nommer trois personnes dont leur contribution en termes d'inspiration, de leadership et de travail n'a pu être égalée : Lcol (à la retraite) Mike McKay, MGen (à la retraite) John Arch MacInnis et le Lgén (à la retraite) Mike Jeffery. Le Régiment royal leur en sera éternellement reconnaissant.

La présence de la statue de McCrae a ajouté un caractère poignant à la cérémonie du jour du Souvenir de cette année au Monument national aux artilleurs. Le 30 RAC a bien organisé cet événement, comme ils le font lorsqu'on leur demande de tirer une salve d'honneur, comme ils le font régulièrement, les jours d'importance nationale dans la capitale.

Le jour de la Sainte-Barbe a été célébré avec brio de Victoria à Halifax et j'ai eu la chance de participer à deux commémorations représentées par un rassemblement d'artilleurs digne de mention et agréable – à Gagetown le 4 décembre avec le 4e Régiment d'artillerie (AG) et l'EARC et le jour suivant, à Shawinigan, avec l'ensemble des Régts d'artillerie de la 2e Division du Canada.

Pour terminer, j'aimerais attirer l'attention du Régts sur deux remarquables contributions à la conservation de notre histoire et patrimoine faits dans la deuxième moitié de l'année.

La première était la magnifique restauration d'un obusier BI de 6 pouces de la Première Guerre mondiale, et qui a été présenté au 3 RAC (The Loyal Company), ARC, et à la Loyal Company Association. Ce projet a été mis en œuvre et financé par le col hon John Irving et a été réalisé sous le leadership technique de l'Adjuc (M artil) (à la retraite) Joe Jordan et les artisans de Source Atlantic Limited à Saint John. Elle constitue une commémoration digne du service des artilleurs du Nouveau-Brunswick au fil des années.

La deuxième contribution était un cadeau de 100 000 \$ par le Col (à la retraite) A. Britton Smith MC, CD, c.r. au Fonds régimentaire de l'ARC pour faire avancer les projets du Programme du patrimoine régimentaire. Le Col Smith est un bienfaiteur de longue date du Régts ainsi que d'autres causes valables dans sa ville natale de Kingston. Membre de la génération la plus glorieuse du Canada, ses exploits comme OOA pendant la Bataille de Normandie en 1944 lui ont valu la Croix militaire. Tandis que nous sommes inspirés par les gestes courageux de Brit d'il y a 71 ans, nous trouvons un modèle de dévouement pour le bien-être du Régts, de la collectivité et du pays dans ses gestes d'aujourd'hui. Son exemple nous motive tous à redoubler d'efforts pour nous assurer que notre service comme membre du Régiment royal donne les résultats dignes de notre embauche et que la confiance qu'il nous porte est justifiée.

In my message in last year's Canadian Gunner I noted that The Royal Regiment of Canadian Artillery was undergoing a period of transition and uncertainty.

As we move into 2016 it is clear that this period of transition and uncertainty continues. The recent election has resulted in the transition to a new Federal government, with the impact to DND and the CAF not yet realized. The absence of a named mission means we Gunners, as part of the Defence Team, must remain vigilant and continue to train to a high standard and be ready to deploy despite the uncertainty of a mission abroad.

Additionally, we have progressed work with the RCA Family Strategy, which aims to be a unifying strategic vision for the Canadian Artillery and its many constituent parts. This document was updated in 2015 and sets the conditions for future work across The Royal Regiment as we begin to translate that vision into action in 2016. I am looking forward to see in our various regions the senate supporting our heritage, our soldiers and their families.

As we prepare, ever vigilant, for an uncertain future, we Gunners must remain ready, flexible, and agile. We do not yet know where, when or what, but there is no doubt that we will be called upon by Canada to act in some capacity. It is not a matter of "if" but rather of "when". Looking at our past, history has proven that we are often called to action on short notice, and equally often to unanticipated locations. Examples include our deployments to Afghanistan and the Balkans, and indeed at home supporting our citizens during humanitarian disasters. I must stress the importance that while we do not yet have definition on a mission, it is the responsibility of every Gunner to remain operationally pre-

New equipment like Ground Based Air Munitions Defence or the Light Armoured Vehicle OP 6.0 with CCIV and TOFCUS will also arrive, perhaps more slowly than we would like, but we will adapt as we always have and optimize the equipment that we have, using it in ways that were never envisioned when it was procured. The team at Directorate Land Requirements continues to serve us well in terms of looking to the future and sharing information critical to the field force.

As targeting becomes more and more a focus for the CAF, we need to continue to enable the execution of this function by incorporating the knowledge brought back from ops overseas to convert lessons learned into knowledge used. Officers and NCMs who have operated at the operational (and above) level are now helping us translate that knowledge into influencing this process as it moves forward within the CAF. Targeting lives and belongs in the Joint realm, but without an understanding of how the process works, and how to service the interest of the land environment, we risk being left out of the discussion. This - we cannot afford.

The ability to bond together and speak as one on these and Artillery issues remains one of our strengths as a Regt. We are able to come together, share issues of collective interest, and work through problems developing truly unique, innovative and at times novel solutions to difficult problems. That is because we are fortunate to be populated by people who think critically, evaluate quickly and effectively and communicate articulately. This remains part of my vision, and is what I have tried to capture in the campaign plan year after year.

The Regt is served by all of us, and to the same extent it serves us. Being part of the Regt means that we all share the responsibility to serve where and when we are asked to. It is vital that we continue to do so in a manner that reflects the honour and pride that we all have in our cap badges. Whether you are serving with the Regular or Reserve force, or that you are an Officer or an NCO, and that you are still serving or retired, I encourage you to stay connected. 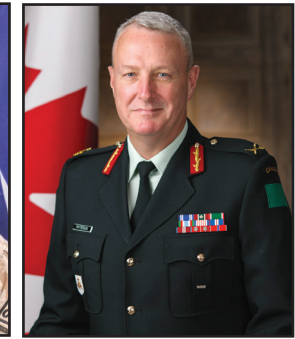

1 RCHA was occupied providing direct support to a number of signature pan-RCA events this past year. In June the Regt played host to the RCA Reunion, as well as the RCA JOC in October. The RCA Reunion was a well-attended and spirited affair, which included a Family day in the Training Area, punctuated by a live, joint fire power demonstration and a cameo appearance by a distinguished WW II veteran, Gnr Carl Roseveare. The JOC was represented by candidates from the Regular and Reserve units across Canada, who were treated to a number of key note presentations.

1 RCHA was privileged to participate in numerous recognition and dedication ceremonies as well. We recognized a number of members with the time honoured Gunner tradition of firing their last round, to include the outgoing Commander Home Station, LCol S. Joudrey, and LGen (Ret'd) Jeffrey. We also paid a surprise visit to the RCA Museum in the form of a "flash parade" to bid a fond farewell to the unsuspecting RCA Adjt and former RSM 1 RCHA, Capt C. Barth, after 35 years of dedicated and loyal service. On 29 Apr, we marked the 25th Anniversary of TRIG KEEN with a re-dedication ceremony attended by his widow Ms. Mary Keen. On 3 May the CO and RSM were fortunate to attend the unveiling and dedication of the John McCrae statue at Gunner Park in Ottawa. In July, a small contingent led by the 2IC, Maj H. Nelson, attended the commissioning ceremony of the Canadian Coast Guard Vessel NICHOLA GODARD, MSM in Victoria, BC.

1 RCHA was also engaged in numerous community relations outside our traditional Remembrance Day celebrations. This included the 61st Threshermen's Reunion in Austin, and the "No

Stone Left Alone" ceremony at Hillside Cemetery in Portage La Prairie. A modest appearance was made in the form of a colour party for the installation ceremony for the Lieutenant-Governor General of Manitoba and we were represented during the 103rd Grey Cup in Winnipeg.

Throughout the year our members also made significant contributions to the local Army Cadet program. The Regt provided direct support to the Army Cadet Challenge weekend in September while it continued to work closely with the Army Cadet League of Manitoba in establishing

an official sponsorship of the 1 RCHA Army Cadets, which was recognized as the best Army Cadet Corps over four provinces. Meanwhile, we maintained a strong affiliation with 3rd Canadian Division Reserve units through numerous collective training ventures such as the premier Artillery concentration, Ex WESTERN DEFENDER, conducted in Shilo in August. Equally important was the close collaboration and partnership with Base Shilo and 2 PPCLI on a mix of local events and training activities.

1 RCHA maintained its commitment to supporting army training rationalization and capability development efforts for the Artillery and CA. In doing so we stepped up to support exported training on behalf of The RCAS, delivering the DP 1 NCM and M777 Detachment Commander Courses. The Regt rigorously developed and shaped force generation and employment concepts for the STA Bty within Close Support Regts across the Corps. These efforts were complimented by the fielding of the Raven B MUAS, including a parachute capable detachment which now plays an integral part of B Coy (Para), 3 PPCLI. The Regt also invested significantly to support broader CA digitization efforts while fielding the first installation of the LAV OPV

6.0. Once more, the Regt was decisively engaged with ALIC in advancing the evolution of the JTAC capability.

From an ops and training perspective, 1 RCHA has certainly lived up to our motto “Ubique.” This past year saw the Regt heavily invested in operational training commitments and strategic engagements throughout a host of venues at home and abroad as it transitioned from reconstitution to the Road to High Readiness. On the home front, the unit was equally occupied with force generation activities. In July, approximately 30 soldiers deployed on Op LENTUS as part of JTFW’s response to assist the Province of Saskatchewan with firefighting efforts in the vicinity of LaRonge/Prince Albert, Saskatchewan. In November, the Regt partnered with Reserve Artillery Units from across the 3rd division to deploy a composite Gun Troop on Op PALACI for Avalanche Control ops in support of Parks Canada in Roger’s Pass, BC.

The 1st Regiment’s ubiquitous ways were clearly observed through the wide range of Bty activities and accomplishments throughout the year.

A Bty

With the implementation of Road to High Readiness training, A Bty became rerolled to form a light Mortar Troop, which offered new challenges to the Officers and Soldiers, many of whom had not experienced the demands of deploying in a dismounted mortar role. Immediately, A Bty set out on a challenging summer that kicked off with Ex TRACKING GUNNER, an escape and evasion exercise in Riding Mountain National Park including 10 K9 Teams and Terry Grant, the original Mantracker, assisting law enforcement officials in searching for the evading teams of troops for over a 40 km trace. Throughout the summer, while

assisting 3rd Canadian Division Training Centre Shilo with firing troop tasks, the bty “sharpened their axe” by developing soldier skills and completed IBTS and BTS up to troop level. The culmination of this training saw the bty stepping off on Ex SILVERBACK GUNNER, a demanding week of dismounted training that included an Urban Ops deployment within the town of Wawanesa, a tactical river crossing via the Assiniboine River into the Shilo RTA where the tubes were deployed in a CBRN environment. A Bty deployed to CFB Wainwright in order to train alongside 3 PPCLI during Ex SPARTAN FORGE. The bty supported both defensive and offensive operations throughout this ex and returned home confident in their abilities integrating with supported arm forces. A Bty sent a contingent to Rogers Pass, BC in order to continue to support Op PALACI. ‘A’ Troop was given the task this year and deployed in early November in order to train themselves for the demands of Avalanche Control. With the majority of the soldiers of ‘A’ Troop deploying on their first rotation of Op PALACI there is an excitement and determination to ensure they meet the standard of professionalism expected of all soldiers in A Bty.

B Bty

B Bty participated in over a dozen exs for fundamental soldier and gunnery skills in support of the manoeuvre arms of 1 CMBG. B Bty supported Op PALACI in Rogers Pass for Avalanche Control and transitioned into honing their winter warfare and survival skills. B Bty continued to support training and tighten gunnery skills by supporting 1 PPCLI with 81mm mortars and conducting live trench clearing drills with grenades. Members from B Bty were an elusive target during Ex MAPLE RESOLVE as OPFOR, testing the capabilities of 5 CMBG on their Road to High Readiness. In conjunction with 1 PPCLI, B Bty soldiers participated in adventure training in Banff, experiencing what

the Rockies had to offer. Following summer leave, B Bty welcomed a new BSM, MWO B. LaRocque, and sent off their outgoing BSM, MWO T. Buchanan, after a highly rewarding and successful tenure. B Bty exercised its soldiers over the summer with three key training events that honed in on basic soldier and gunnery skills: Ex NAV BEAST, Ex DETACHMENT BEAST and Ex DEADLY BEAST. The momentum generated from these exs carried on into the New Year as B Bty prepares for its role during this period of high readiness.

C Bty

Providing STA support to 1 RCHA and 1 CMBG, C Bty has had a year full of opportunities and progress. Winter exercises, focusing on cold weather operations of STA equipment and ba-



sic winter warfare served to improve the skills of all members, testing the resolve of both soldier and sensor in equal measure. The spring saw the first airborne deployment of the MUAS alongside 3 PPCLI, an event which had earned the distinction of those members to wear the maroon beret. Along with showcasing STA capabilities across the Bde, C Bty still managed to continue growing the ranks of MUAS Operators through training and supporting the exs of the other btys. Maintaining and improving the skill sets of AWLS operators, an AWLS operator course was conducted over the summer, with students testing their knowledge and concluding the course with field time on Ex LIMBER SENSOR, a week-long bty level ex in September with an active enemy force. This realistic element saw the bty modestly accepting the limitations of a small detachment's ability to act as a fighting force and the ability of C Bty to effectively defend a hide if properly coordinated with sound tactics. The fall training campaign consisted of a STA Tech course which introduced members to the bigger picture and encouraged them to think critically. The STACC continued to develop their relationships with BG and Bde HQ through CAXs, including Ex VIDAR RAM and Ex UNIFIED RESOLVE in Edmonton, and Ex JUPITER RAM in California. On the Road to High Readiness, the New Year will see members from C Bty supporting multiple training venues in order to enhance their capabilities and rapport with their supported arms.

Z Bty

Z Bty continued to provide support to BGs through FOOs and JTACs. Z Bty began the 2015 campaign with Ex FROZEN GUNNER, which saw the soldiers conduct a 6 km snowshoe march followed by the construction of snow defenses in Shilo. Concurrent to exercising the basic soldier skills, BC Z, Maj W. Hunt, challenged the FOO parties with Special Procedure sets to maintain gunnery skills of the OPs. As the LAV 6.0 OPVs rolled into the Regt, Z Bty took the lead on all conversion training within the unit. No stranger to OUTCAN exs, FOOs were deployed to support the annual USMC Divisional level CAX, Ex JUPITER RAM, which exercised 1 CMBG's staff and those of allied nations, specifically the US and the UK. The bty took advantage of this ex, where they conducted unit level planning with the affiliated support arms commander to generate a realistic input into the scenario, while establishing a key relationship with US and British counterparts. The British remain a close ally and, as such, cooperative training continued on Ex MAPLE LION in Suffield, AB, where a large contingent Z and B Btys participated in this key strategic engagement. Valuable lessons were learned and shared with the Household Cavalry Regiment (HCR), experiences which enabled interoperability with our British counterparts. The JTACs travelled through the US and as far abroad as Australia in order to sharpen their skills with allied air forces. These influential engagements aided both the allied pilots and our JTACs in maintaining necessary currencies to remain combat ready. Z Bty's commitment to supporting training with other units continued with the support of the BC's Fire Plan-

ning Course, 1RCHA exs and exs with our supported arms from across 1 CMBG in Western Canada.

HQ & Svcs Bty

HQ Bty continued to deliver rapid and continuous support in order to meet the diverse sustainment requirements of 1 RCHA. Members of LMT demonstrated their skills by supporting the Regt on exes in Wainwright, Dundurn, Suffield, and at home in Shilo. This year, support extended as far as Rogers Pass, BC for Avalanche Control. LMT led the Bty's training with Winter Warfare in Spruce Woods Park, and two IBTS exercises in the late summer. As well, members of LMT participated in Ex RECOVERY RAM in Edmonton to test their technical skills. Throughout the year, techs were ready to enable the movement of vehicles, including redistribution for the Road to High Readiness campaign. With the divestment of fleets and limited availability of parts, 1 RCHA techs worked hard to consistently maintain one of the lowest VORs in the Bde. Signal Troop continued the process of digitization in cooperation with 1 CMBG HQ & Sig Sqn to establish LCSS servers in Shilo. 1 RCHA Sigs did the Regt proud when they placed among the top low-power teams on international high-frequency radio competition Ex NOBLE SKYWAVE. Finally, the Bty bid a fond farewell in June to the outgoing command team, BC Maj S. Burke, and BSM MWO A. Harris. The new command team, BC Maj C. Hudson, and BSM MWO T. Jesseau were enthusiastically welcomed as part of the team. With its diverse set of skills, HQ Bty consistently achieves excellence and enables the effectiveness of 1 RCHA.

Indeed, it was another busy and prosperous year for 1 RCHA. Our success was directly attributable to the monumental effort exerted by all members and their families, one for which all members are grateful and justifiably proud. Starting in April 2016, the 1 RCHA gears up for its Road to High Readiness validation training in Wainwright. Following this culminating event 1 RCHA are setting their sights on high readiness commitments commencing in July 2016, while remaining postured to support domestic operations on the home front.

The 2nd Regt Royal Canadian Horse Artillery welcomed 2015 with a frosty start as each Bty held their winter warfare training. This year saw D Bty members take the plunge through the ice, E Bty got the chance to experience ice fishing, and HQ Bty conducted an austere range on a lake. The Gunners fought through bitter cold conditions, and made it through with new skill sets. Meanwhile, Y Bty kicked off 2015 with a blast, holding a gun camp which gave soldiers the opportunity to hone their direct fire skills. A FOO party from Y Bty also went out the door in January, landing in Poland as part of Op REASSURANCE, a NATO-led multinational exercise accompanying the 3 RCR Recce Platoon.

In February, Y and D Btys both conducted professional development trips. D Bty complete traveled to the Canadian War Museum where they were able to reconnect with their history – specifically a 12 pdr field gun that was used in rearguard action at Leliefontein by D Bty Gunners. Y Bty travelled to the Borden Military Museum and General Dynamics Land Systems Canada in London, ON, giving soldiers of the Bty an opportunity to look back at the storied history of the Canadian Military and then to focus forward at new technology in the LAV 6.0 that is currently filtering into our lines. E Bty spent many weeks between February and March shooting in support of the FOO course, and found themselves with over a thousand rounds of 105 mm ammunition to shoot, leading to some excellent full-rate Fire Plans. Meanwhile, much of the Regt leadership along with the FSCC and STACC enabled 2 CMBG to field a robust LOCON in a simulated Warfighter exercise under 38 (US) ID in Indiana.

The springtime was busy with the Regt supporting various endeavours and our manning light on the ground, but we made it work. Between March and May, many of the Btys were support-

ing various Regt, Bde, and national courses, to include DP1 NCM, FOO, CSOR-led small arms range, OCT support to Ex MAPLE RESOLVE 15, and the BC's Fire Planning course in Gagetown. In May 2015, Nepal experienced catastrophic earthquakes that devastated the region. E Bty made a large contribution to the DART mission, responding to the call and rapidly deploying to the region where they contributed to the humanitarian relief effort.

As June and July rolled around, the Regiment was

able to catch its breath and enjoy adventure training as well as summer block leave. D Bty spent a week in Algonquin Provincial Park where their canoe trip took them a total of 52km by water and 10km portaging. E Bty spent their week canoeing and hiking, as well as some intense white water rafting, which provided its soldiers a chance to recharge their batteries after a busy spring. F Bty embarked on a 4 day, 90km paddle on the Rideau Canal up to Kingston, where they spent their last day touring Fort Henry for professional development. Y Bty conducted a four-day exercise within Algonquin Park where the Bty spent three days canoeing, camping, and team building. On the final day, Y Bty members experienced white water rafting on the Ottawa River. HQ Bty spent three days with guides from Wilderness Tours, canoeing, portaging, and rafting on the Madawaska River, resulting in a fantastic trip that proved to be excellent for morale.

The Regt was refreshed and ready to get back in the swing of things in August, after summer block leave. 2 CMBG's main effort in August was Ex STALWART GUARDIAN which saw Reservists from across Ontario deploy to the Petawawa training area, reinforced by the Regular Force Bde. The Regt, as a whole, had a large part in supporting the Ex with mentors from D and E Bty embedded with the Reserve Artillery units to share

their experiences. The remainder of D and E Bty served as enemy force. Y, F, and HQ Bty all provided support to the Reserve Artillery units that was critical to the exercise. Of note, Y Bty supported the 32 CBG week-long CAX by manning the Bde FSCC, augmenting three battle group FSCCs, supplying nine FOO parties, and JTAC support. For these efforts, Y Bty received two coins from Commander 32 CBG who noted that the CAX training value would have been greatly diminished without the support of Y Bty. For the force on force portion of the exercise, Y Bty provided six FOO parties and three JTACs while augmenting two battle group FSCCs. The exercise clearly demonstrated what the Artillery brings to the fight.

During the first week of September, as has become tradition, 2 RCHA supported Ex COLLABORATIVE SPIRIT which saw E Bty conduct a driving stand, firepower demonstration, and an airmobile demonstration for many military and civilian VIPs. D Bty also conducted their Bty level exercise in September, supported by Y and HQ Bty. Ex ROLLING DRAGON saw the Bty deploy with both guns and mortars and focused on less frequently practised training like dispersed positions and Artillery raids.

October has always been a busy month for 2 RCHA, and 2015 was no different. This year marked the inaugural LCol Bobbitt Memorial Mil Skills Competition. This competition consisted of various stands such as, rappelling, obstacle course, KIM games and First Aid scenarios that tested the physical and mental capabilities of all the teams. It was a full day event and had all available members of 2 RCHA participating. It proved to be an enjoyable and challenging event for all, and we look forward to it next year. Y Bty also supported the combined E and F Bty exercise in October. This exercise focused not only on indirect fire, but members of the btys also took advantage of support from 427 Special Operations Aviation Regt (SOAR) utilizing two CH-146 to conduct live and dry Close Combat Attacks (CCA), as well as, air mobile operations for F Bty LCMR and AWLS detachments. The opportunities to conduct live and dry training with CH-146s were new experiences for many members of the btys and the Regt as a whole. At the end of October, E Bty, with support from Y Bty, travelled to Fort Drum, NY to work with 3-6 Fd Artillery Regt (3-6 FAR), 10th Mountain Division for Ex MOUNTAIN ECHO. Working with 3-6 FAR provided E Bty with an excellent

November was a month filled with history, remembrance, and connecting with our communities. 2 RCHA supported Remembrance ceremonies in various communities to include Corbeil, Kingston, and Renfrew. As is tradition, the Regiment conducted the Canoe River Memorial in remembrance of the tragedy that struck its members on 21 November 1950. At the end of the month, D Bty provided a detachment with a 12 pdr gun to par-

ticipate in the Leliefontein parade hosted by the Royal Canadian Dragoons.

As usual the year culminated in December with silly season. 2 RCHA can look back at a busy year that we had and be proud of all the new challenges and accomplishments that 2015 brought. It was a full year filled with new experiences, building relationships with other units on base, as well as, internationally, and above all building cohesion as a Regt. It is without a doubt that the 2nd Regt can say we are stronger now than ever before and ready for the challenges that lie ahead in 2016.

L'année 2015 a été une année occupée pour le 5^e Régiment d'artillerie légère du Canada (5 RALC). Comme toutes les années, nous avons participé à l'exercice annuel de Brigade en fin janvier, l'Ex RAFALE BLANCHE (RB 15). Cet exercice contient du tir réel dans les secteurs de la BS 2 Div CA Valcartier ainsi que la mise en valeur des défis lors de la guerre hivernale. Au même moment, nous avons des éléments déployés sur la continuité de l'Op PALACI en appui à Parc Canada dans l'Ouest canadien.

Ensuite, nous avons commencé à nous préparer pour notre montée en puissance pour la Force opérationnelle 1-15. Le premier exercice pour nous préparer était en février avec l'Ex PIÈCES MOBILES (PM 15) à la BS 2 DIV CA Valcartier. En plus d'aiguiser nos talents et nos compétences individuelles à titre de régiment, le 5 RALC a également appuyé le cours de commandant adjoint de poste d'observation. De plus, cet exercice a permis de confirmer la qualification de guerre hivernale.

C'est à Wainwright, en Alberta, que la confirmation de tous nos efforts s'est concrétisée. En effet, la montée en puissance s'est confirmée par un exercice au niveau de brigade, Ex MAPLE RESOLVE (MR 15) ainsi que l'Ex RÉFLEXE RAPIDE (RR 15). Plusieurs membres du Régiment se sont rendus à Wainwright pour appuyer la brigade lors des deux portions de l'exercice. La première portion était d'une durée de deux semaines contre un ennemi Batterien réel, caractérisée par Batterien peu de repos et beaucoup de mouvement. La seconde portion consistait d'appuyer les attaques d'équipe de combat de manières statiques avec du 155 mm ou avec des tirs de harcèlement avec nos mortiers 81 mm.

Dès le retour des troupes à Valcartier, des changements majeurs étaient à l'horaire. Tout d'abord, un changement de



commandement au niveau de brigade se fait entre le Colonel Dany Fortin et le Colonel Michel-Henry St-Louis. Ensuite, peu de temps après, c'est au tour du 5 RALC de changer de commandant. Le Lieutenant-Colonel Jean-François Duval passe alors le flambeau au Lieutenant-Colonel Francis Poitras. Le SMR Éric St-Pierre cède également sa place au nouveau SMR l'Adjudant-Chef Ghislain Angel.

En juin, le Régiment a été endeuillé par la nouvelle du décès du Bdrct Sébastien Demers de

la Bie V. Nos pensées vont à la famille et aux amis de Sébastien qui ont subi cette triste perte de leur fils, de leur frère, et de leur camarade.

Au retour des congés estivaux, le 5 RALC a eu une journée de Défi du Commandant avec une compétition de patrouille de reconnaissance. Cet exercice, très éprouvant physiquement, consistait à pouvoir reconnaître plusieurs points dans les secteurs d'entraînement de la BS 2 DIV CA Valcartier. Après trois jours de marches et de défis, le commandant du 5 RALC a couronné la Bie R. La Bie R devient également les vainqueurs de la première édition de cette compétition. Évidemment, cette compétition avait pour but de développer la cohésion et l'esprit de corps au Régiment en développant les compétences de bases d'un soldat. L'ambiance au barbecue de postexercice nous confirmait que la mission avait bel et bien été accomplie.

Il ne faudrait pas oublier nos membres qui ont été déployés sur un exercice à long terme sur l'Ex TRIDENT JUNCTURE (TJ 15) au Portugal ainsi que de l'Op RÉASSURANCE en Pologne. Cet exercice d'envergure internationale est marqué par la présence de plusieurs membres du 5 RALC, spécialement des membres de poste d'observation et des membres qui sont qualifiés parachutistes.

Des membres du Régiment ont aussi participé à la course de fran-





chissement d'obstacles. La compétition de piste à obstacle a été marquée par la troisième place du Lt Lavigne chez les femmes et de la deuxième place du Sgt Dion chez les 30 à 39 ans. Il est également à noter que le 5 RALC a terminé deuxième à l'épreuve par section et a été couronné champion à l'épreuve à relais.

Le Rég't a reçu une autre mauvaise nouvelle au début du mois de novembre. Le décès du BrdC (Ret.) Martin Bédard. Tout le Rég't était invité à se recueillir et à offrir du soutien à la famille à la chapelle de la BS 2 DIV CA Valcartier. Nos pensées sont avec les amis et la famille en cette rude épreuve.

L'arrivée des immigrants syriens fait également en sorte que plusieurs des membres sont détachés de l'unité dans le cadre de l'Op PROVISION. L'OP PROVISION a été créée afin de potentiellement fournir un lieu d'habitation provisoire aux immigrants syriens sur la BS 2 DIV CA Valcartier. Le Maj M. Voyer de la Bie Q est le commandant de la compagnie responsable pour les accueillir.

L'année a culminé avec l'exercice annuel régimentaire, l'Ex BOMBARDE BORDÉE (BB 15) en fin novembre. Celui-ci nous a permis de confirmer plusieurs cours régimentaires et de continuer notre préparation pour la montée en puissance. Elle a été suivie des programmes mandatés et nous avons aussi pris le temps de souligner les efforts de chacun avec une fête de la troupe où un groupe rock, un taureau mécanique et un shack à patate étaient de la partie. Il va sans dire que la fête fut un succès. L'année s'est ensuite terminée avec les diners de batterie et un dîner de la troupe.

Bie X

Parmi les événements marquants durant l'année 2015 dans la Bie X, il est à noter deux changements dans l'état-major de la bie. Le cmdt de la Bie X est passé du Maj M. Morin au Maj P. Lebel le 18 mai à la BFC Wainwright. Le SMB a aussi changé alors que l'Adjum P. Carrière a cédé sa place à l'Adjum M. Morneau le 23 novembre.

Identifié à titre de bie pour la force opérationnelle 1-15, la Bie X a effectué l'entraînement de la montée en puissance et a participé aux exercices MR et RR 15 du 19 avril au 13 juin à la BFC

Wainwright.

La Bie X a aussi appuyé les cours de formation des nouveaux artilleurs. Autant au niveau des soldats que des officiers. Elle a appuyé le cours de PP1 au CI 2 DIV CA du 15 au 21 juillet. La Bie X a aussi appuyé le cours de DP1.2 du 10 septembre au 2 décembre, exporté de l'École du Régiment Royal de l'artillerie canadienne vers la BS 2 DIV CA Valcartier.

Un détachement de CCFA ainsi que deux détachements de poste d'observation ont participé à l'EX TJ 15 au Portugal du 16 octobre au 10 novembre. La Bie X a aussi appuyé l'Ex CASTOR AGUERRI du 30 novembre au 3 décembre avec du tir d'artillerie et deux détachements de poste d'observation et de contrôleurs aériens avancés.

Malgré le tempo très élevé tout au long de l'année, les membres de la bie ont réussi à entièrement satisfaire les attentes. Avec la multitude d'exercices que la Bie X a appuyé, elle a su augmenter son professionnalisme, sa cohésion, sa polyvalence, sa compréhension du champ de bataille complexe et elle en retire surtout une grande fierté de servir dans les FAC.

Bie Q

La Bie Q a eu une année très chargée en termes d'exercices et tâches avec des nouveautés au niveau de la composition de ses effectifs, de ses exercices au niveau régimentaire et de brigade et de ses procédures. Elle a d'ailleurs débuté en participant à l'exercice hivernal RB 15 en fournissant un CCSAO à la brigade et en déployant les éléments de la Bie Q dans les secteurs d'entraînement de Valcartier. La bie a reçu deux autres postes de capteurs acoustiques (PCA) pour sa troupe SCARA pour un total de six et de nouvelles mises à jour du logiciel pour le RAML ont été configurées. La montée en puissance de la batterie s'est effectuée durant l'Ex MR 15 du 20 avril au 3 mai à Wainwright où

les membres ont fourni un CCSAO et déployés ses éléments.

Lors de la période estivale, le 9 juillet il y a eu le changement du SMB de l'Adj S. Gauvreau à l'Adjum A. Filion. Les cadres de la bie ont participé à des déploiements internationaux, soit pour un exercice et un tour en théâtre opérationnel. Le CB, Maj M. Voyer, a été déployé au Koweït du 15 juin au 15 octobre dans le cadre de l'Op IMPACT. De plus,

le Capt D. Hoyt a été employé comme officier d'ISTAR au niveau de la brigade lors de l'Ex TJ 15 au Portugal du 16 octobre au 10 novembre. Cette participation de la chaîne de commandement a permis d'approfondir les connaissances des procédures SAO et ISTAR qu'utilisent les autres pays et d'augmenter les compétences des membres de la bie.

Durant l'année 2015, la Bie Q a développé ses capacités de systèmes aériens téléguidés miniatures (MUAS) en détachant ses éléments aux autres unités de la brigade pour plusieurs exercices. Cette nouvelle capacité de surveillance aérienne facilite la préparation et la planification des opérations pour les unités. Les armes appuyées apprécient énormément ce que leur apporte la Bie Q.



L'année s'est terminée avec l'Ex BB 15 pendant lequel, pour la première fois, la bie a appuyé le cours d'officier de SAO de Gagetown du 16 au 27 novembre. Cette coopération entre le 5 RALC et l'école d'artillerie a solidifié la relation entre les deux entités et a amélioré l'affiliation pour permettre une meilleure collaboration pour les tâches dans le futur.

Somme tout, ce fut une année très chargée pour la Bie Q qui a présenté de nombreux défis que les membres ont accomplis avec succès et fierté.

Bie R

La bie a commencé l'année avec sa participation sur l'Ex RB 15 en fournissant des éléments en appui au 3 R22R. Par la suite, la bie a été déployée dans le cadre de l'Ex PIÈCES MOBILES (PM 15) pour appuyer le Rég et le cours de commandant adjoint du poste d'observation. De plus, la bie fut incluse sur l'Ex MR 15. Lors de cet exercice, plusieurs membres de la batterie ont participé au support du groupe tactique d'artillerie (GTA) et au CMTC. Le GTA au 3 R22R et les opérations démontées ont eu leurs lots de défis. Au cœur du GTA de la Bie R se trouvait plusieurs éléments internationaux attachés ; une équipe SALT du 1st Anglico Marines, une équipe d'observateur Britannique du Right Flank Rifles, une équipe d'observateur de Bayonnet Coy de la Georgie ainsi qu'un JTAC du US Air Force.

Ce fut un été chargé pour les membres de la batterie, une équipe d'observateur a participé au Festival aérien de Bagotville pour exposer les capacités du VBL III OPV et un détachement de M777 a participé à l'activité de rayonnement CON FORZA au parc d'attractions de la Ronde. Plusieurs tirs de salut ont eu lieu pendant cette période, la batterie a souligné la fête du Canada et les changements de commandant du R22R, tous à la Citadelle.

Au mois de juillet, Capt Derek Gaudreault, Bdr Marco Drolet, Bdr Benjamin Morin-Boucher et Bdr Guillaume Anglehart-Methot ont quitté pour l'Op RÉASSURANCE avec la Compagnie A du 3 R22R dans le cadre de l'opération visant l'intégration d'éléments multinationaux en Pologne. La rotation de G21 se terminera au début de l'année 2016.

Au retour des vacances d'été, la bie a pris part à une compétition de patrouille au niveau de détachement. La performance de tous les détachements fut au-dessus de la moyenne régimentaire. Grâce à ces excellents résultats, la bie a eu le grand honneur de remporter la première épreuve d'une compétition régimentaire pour déterminer la meilleure bie au cours de l'année. Depuis, le fanion de la suprématie flotte fièrement au-dessus de la porte du commandant de la batterie, Maj S. Guay.

Dans le cadre d'exercice au niveau de bie, nous avons été déployés au mois de septembre et octobre lors des Ex ROMÉO SICCUS et ROMÉO DÉFENSIF. Lors de ces deux exercices, la bie a exécuté plusieurs déploiements à sec, des tâches de harcèlements, insertions héliportées, creusage d'une position défensive d'infanterie, champ de tir C6, C7, ainsi que des parcours de combat en tir réel. Cet exercice a été réalisé en collaboration avec le 5 RGC et le 430 ETHA qui ont offert leur appui. Finalement, l'année 2015 fut une année remplie de défis et d'opportunités afin de faire refléter la capacité et le professionnalisme de la bie au sein du Rég et du 5 GBMC.

Bie CS

L'année a débuté sur une bonne note pour la Bie CS en fournissant un appui complet à l'unité durant RB 15. Avec une coordination à la hauteur des attentes, elle a pu fournir toutes les ressources nécessaires autant pour l'équipement et

l'alimentation que les divers exercices d'élingages faits par la Bie X dans les secteurs d'entraînement de la BS 2 Div CA Valcartier. Une fois de retour au rég, la Bie CS mettait déjà l'accent sur le prochain exercice, Ex PM 15, afin de permettre aux véhicules et l'équipement d'être prêt à l'emploi. La Bie CS a été en mesure compléter l'entraînement individuel et collectif de son personnel au cours de cette semaine.

Le printemps a finalement cogné à nos portes. La priorité de préparer l'envoi de véhicules et du matériel essentiel à notre travail s'est installé vite dans nos tâches: destination Wainwright, Alberta. Après un mois d'acharnement et de dur labeur pour les diverses sections techniques, la Bie CS a été en mesure de fournir toutes les ressources nécessaires pour le déploiement de l'artillerie à MR 15. Un merci particulier aux mécaniciens qui ont fourni un rendement exceptionnel et travaillé plusieurs heures supplémentaires.

Au retour des vacances d'été, la Bie CS a enclenché l'Ex SUPPORT MONTAGNEUX, afin de mettre au défi le personnel au niveau physique et mental en complétant une ascension de 1200m dans le Parc des Hautes-Gorges-de-la-Rivière-Malbaie. Sur une durée de trois jours, les gens ont dûment complété un total de 50 km au travers les divers sentiers du parc national. Un accent a particulièrement été mis sur la cohésion d'équipe en organisant les marches en groupes et le soir venu, un rassemblement autour d'un feu de camp avec les membres de la bie. Avec un paysage hors du commun et une température clémente, la Batterie CS a trouvé ce séjour mémorable. Une ligue de balle molle et de hockey balle a également été planifiée, durant la saison estivale. Entraînant ainsi les diverses cellules composant la bie à participer activement une contre l'autre.

Par ailleurs, la Bie CS a organisé la compétition de patrouille régimentaire 2015 en appuyant activement le déroulement complet de l'exercice de quatre jours dans les secteurs d'entraînement de la BS 2 DIV CA Valcartier. Cette compétition a permis de pousser les limites physiques et mentales de chacun des membres du 5 RALC. La Bie CS a été en mesure de remplir toutes les demandes et de coordonner toutes les ressources essentielles au bon déroulement ainsi que de l'intégration de plusieurs soldats venant de plusieurs unités du 5 GBMC.

L'automne s'est enclenché avec la préparation et l'exécution de l'Ex SUPPORT GUERRIER 15. Cet exercice consistait à exercer la batterie dans un contexte tactique sans avoir à appuyer le 5 RALC. De plus, les NIACs ont été complétés au niveau de batterie en donnant des leçons et un entraînement sur le terrain. Cet entraînement a permis d'accomplir plusieurs objectifs d'entraînement qui intégraient les notions de base du soldat.

Within a frenetic year of conducting world-class Individual Training, The Guns of The Royal Regiment of Canadian Artillery School (RCAS) rarely fell silent as sub-units united in the provision of fire-power. From far-flung international exchanges to constant field deployments, Gunners of The RCAS continually applied steel on target, forging the future of The Royal Regiment of Canadian Artillery (RCA) under the watchful instruction and tutelage of both IGs and AIGs.

2015 witnessed the departure of LCol Masson and CWO Beaudry, as the former command team handed over to LCol Giroux and CWO Vidal. LCol Masson was posted to Ottawa as the Deputy Director of Land Force Development, while CWO Beaudry was appointed as both the Formation Sergeant Major of the Combat Training Centre and RSM RCA.

National calendar training demands necessitated the close work, communication, and cooperation of the Btys of The RCAS to form a sum greater than their individual components. A typical field training exercise would witness 45 Bty providing FOO candidates as 67th Bty trained students both in the CP and on Recce while W Bty provided guns and Gunners to put bullets down range. Indeed, when Advanced Training conducted the DP3 Bty Commander's course, the entirety of The RCAS, from Commandant to Privates Awaiting Training in Steele Troop, were out in the field to ensure high-quality training to students from all across Canada.

WO Larade, within the Standards Cell, ensured exported training was being run to a high standard, in addition to those courses conducted internally at The RCAS. Bdr Vardy of Steele Troop joined the W Battery CANZEX contingent, and worked with 16 Fd Regt's 161 Bty (Close Support) RNZA operating the L119 105 mm Light Gun and 81 mm Mortar.

After many months of hard work and dedication, the Grand

Capt Kaempffer and WO Larade, as Cadet Liaison Officers with the affiliated 3034 Blue Mountain Rangers, were proud to witness the graduation of several cadets during a magnificent parade at Camp Argonaut. For their tireless efforts in support of the Cadets, LCol Masson and CWO Beaudry were invited to the annual Mess Dinner where they enjoyed, as honoured guests, a meal served by the proud community of Browns Flat.

67th Depot Battery

This has been another busy and exciting year for both A Troop (Gun line) and B Troop (STA) within 67th Bty. The operational tempo of The RCAS was definitely felt by the Instructors as they were tasked with multiple courses and secondary duties in support of National training aims. The newest crop of IGs and AIGs posted in were immediately integrated and put to work instructing the next generation of Gunners and Officers. Multiple gun line courses were run throughout the year in support of The RCA's needs which included: DP 1.1 (2 x RegF serials and 1 x PRes serial), DP 1.2, Gun Area TSM (1 x RegF serial and 1 x PRes Mod 1 and 2), GATS (1 x PRes and 1 x RegF serial) and DP1 NCM. There were also multiple STA courses run by B Tp to include: MUAS Det Comd, STA TSM, STA Tech Supervisor, and the STA Officer course.

The Instructors in both A and B Troop conducted various COE support tasks in the form of IG/AIG Assistance taskings to 1 RCHA, 2 RCHA, 5 RALC, 2 Fd Regt and Ex STALWART GUARDIAN in support of the PRes Gunners from Ontario hosted by 2 RCHA. These tasks provided a valuable training tool for the Commanders of the respective Regts by providing unbiased

feedback and coaching regarding unit training events. WO Sarnelli was also tasked in the fall to travel to Yuma, Arizona to participate in PGK trials, giving him an excellent opportunity to see the emerging precision capabilities of Artillery ammunition. Members of B Troop were busy conducting COE tasks as well, travelling to various Artillery and Armoured units to support the implementation of the Raven B MUAS. Assisting in the provision of training for the Bty Commander and Artillery Operations courses, IG and AIGs

45 Depot Battery

The command team of 45 Battery witnessed both a change of command and appointment, as Maj S. Evans took over from Maj R. Nicholson, who was appointed as the CIG, while MWO Hartery left for Base Gagetown and was replaced by MWO Goodland who moved over from W Bty.

FSCC Cell

The FSCC Cell maintained a high tempo, conducting FOO, OPDC, PRes FOO and PRes BC courses, in addition to providing IG assistance on multiple occasions. Capt Gerbrandt assumed the role of SI with WO Gagne as the ASI. The Bty bid farewell to Capt Osbourne who moved to Advanced Training, WO Attrux who was posted to 4 Regt (GS) and WO Coxworthy who moved to FSCC Standards.

COE tasks conducted by the Cell included instructing All-Arms Call for Fire (AACFF) training, assessing AACFF for the Worthington Cup Challenge, and assisting the Army Learning Support Centre with the creation of a fire planning demonstration video. Capt's Chiu and Gerbrandt and WO Gagne attended the Naval Gunfire Liaison Officers course in Coronado, CA. They worked with MARLANT towards increasing the profile and capabilities of Canadian naval fire support for land operations. The FSCC Cell also worked to integrate new kit, such as the LAV 6.0 and the Target Locating Module, STERNA, into fire support TTPs.

Joint Terminal Attack Controller (JTAC) Cell

The term JTAC has officially replaced Forward Air Control in keeping with the terminology used by the US and NATO; though the responsibilities of the Cell remain the same. The JTAC Cell continues to conduct all certification training for the CAF's JTACs, whether from the Army, RCAF or CANSOFCOM. This year the Cell ran three courses: two JTAC and one JTAC - Instructor. This year also saw the implementation of Precision Strike Suite – Special Operations Force (PSS-SOF) software training as a separate but complimentary course to the JTAC and JTAC-I courses. Candidates ranged in rank from Cpl to Maj whose trades included the combat arms, special forces operators, and aircrew. We also saw the first of what will be many allied students, as the New Zealand Defence Force (NZDF) began sending candidates on our courses in exchange for providing us with one of their experienced JTACs as an instructor. Courses continue to be split between the ground school (academic and simulator) in Gagetown, NB and the field portion in Wainwright, AB. Due to the operational commitments of the RCAF on Ops, the live fire portion of the air control phase of one of the courses was divided over three training areas to achieve the requirements. This had instructors and candidates visit air weapons ranges in Shilo, MB, Cold Lake, AB, and Gila Bend, AZ over the course of several months. A logistical and scheduling challenge, all training aims were met, though in far from ideal conditions.

We said goodbye to some experienced JTAC-Is with the departure of WOs Morrell and Zarembo. We also welcomed our first instructor from the NZDF, SSGT Parker.

The JTAC Cell continues to be involved in JTAC Capability Management and assists the Air-Land Integration Cell (ALIC) with a number of issues and working groups. In June, members of the Cell were awarded a CADTC Commander's Commendation for the work accomplished in maintaining and advancing Canada's CAS capability.

AD Cell

The AD Cell welcomed two new members, Capt Smith and Sgt Nowell, from The Royal School of Artillery, UK. Capt Smith was on the UK IG Career Course and Sgt Nowell on the UK Gunnery Career Course. WO Porter moved to the Standards Cell as the AD Rep, and WO Dowe was posted.

In addition to its provision of support to the COE, the AD Cell ran and supported courses throughout the year. WO Beaver acted as The RCAS' advisor on naval gunfire Ex CAGE 3B in NS, with the RCN in January. The purpose of this exercise was to qualify Naval Officers in the employment of naval fires with input from each environment. A visit was also conducted to the AD Airspace Management Cell in Ft Sill, OK, to compare the AD training of the US and Canada. As well, the Cell supported the Artillery Operations Course where they provided staff to the CAX, introducing students to the planning and current operations aspects of airspace coordination.

Courses run by the Cell included the AD Officers Course,

the AD Tech Supervisor and three serials of Tactical Data Link course. The AD Officers Course was exported to the 4 Regt (GS), and received outstanding Regtl support when the entire unit deployed in support of the final FTX. The Tactical Data Link course is run on behalf of the CA, and is the only mechanism in the CA to train and qualify soldiers in the use of NATO standard tactical data links.

Advanced Training Cell

Advanced Training Cell maintained a high tempo and saw significant changes to its manning. Capt Woodill was promoted to Maj and took over as OC from Maj Evans who departed to command 45 Bty. Providing both continuity and guidance, MWO Smith remained as BSM. Capt Paish departed to begin employment with 67th Bty after completing a year as the IG Course Officer. WO Tomlinson, who acted as Course Programmer, was posted to Shilo. Capts Beatty and Osborne took over as Course Officers for IG 1501, while WO Munro returned from second language training to act as Course Programmer. Capt Knox became the AIG Course Officer with WO Cloutier as the Course Programmer.

This year the Cell ran numerous senior Artillery Officer and NCO courses. IG 1401 concluded with eight students receiving brown hats and AIG 1401 awarded six students their white hats. Artillery Operations 1501 saw twenty-eight students complete the course, while Bty Commander 1501 graduated eleven students. Fourteen students completed BSM 1501. IG 1501 commenced with six candidates and AIG 1501 with eighteen.

The Cell also began several other significant projects, including the IG QSTP writing board, review and improvement of Op LION, The RCAS tactical framework for courses, and significant improvement of course material for the Artillery Operations Course.

A team consisting of Sgt Giberson, Bdr Naud, Gnr Haight, and Gnr Linaric participated in the annual Worthington Challenge, consisting of teams from all across Canada. They completed several stands which included completing a 25 mm LAV shoot on mobile and static targets, soldier's obstacle course followed by a 7km run to the 9 mm pistol range, driver obstacle course, night navigation on foot and AFV recognition. They represented The RCAS very well, displaying strong leadership and soldier skills.

Physical fitness remained a top priority within the Bty and it was not more recognized than the efforts put forth by Capt I.

L'année 2015 en fut une très occupée pour le 2nd Fd Regt. 2015 proved to be an excellent year for the 5th (British Columbia) Fd Regt, Royal Canadian Artillery. The year was busy with many exercises and much individual training over the summer months. As usual, the past year in 7th Toronto Regt, RCA has been very busy. The Regt maintained two independent firing sub-units. Both 9 Bty (105 mm) and 15 Bty (81 mm) deploy concurrently with their own support and their own manoeuvre arms element. After a successful 2 week Ex STALWART GUARDIAN 15, in which the Regt was exposed to a fully functioning Service and Support Bty, the Regt is developing a similar capability within its own HQ Bty.

This also has marked the final year under the leadership of LCol Paul Szabunio. He dedicated an immense amount of thought and effort in utilizing the local Artillery Associations and confirming the Regtl Family concept. His efforts were expertly augmented by our HCol and HLCOL; all of whom developed the Regt's Senate into a strong advisory board for the CO with the backing of the Toronto Gunners Association and the Limber Gunners Association. This partnership proved fruitful in March at the Toronto Garrison Officers Ball, which was a tremendous success. The event had the theme of VE Day +70. The wait staff was dressed in 1940's attire and the 800 guests entered the dining room under an arch of burlap sandbags. Each garrison sub-unit and the HMCS York were invited to provide a display from their respective museums. In the Artillery tradition, there were no speeches during the dinner resulting in the dancing and after party starting at least 90 minutes earlier than anytime in living memory of the annual event. The only Guests of Honour were the families of 4 local soldiers who lost sons in Afghanistan. We will remember them. The proceeds from the event went towards sending a

handful of unit Officers, SNCO's and junior ranks on an all-expenses paid trip to the Netherlands in the spring to trace the Gunners' paths to victory 70 years prior.

The outgoing and inclusive personality that the Regt has taken on was again displayed as Maj J. Stewart led the "200 Years of Firepower" at Old Fort York during Open Doors Toronto in May. The Band serenaded picnickers, while soldiers flipped burgers and the Ladies Auxiliary provided baked goods made with recipes from the Fort's 19th Century Cookbook. Maj Stewart stood in as

GPO and fired two salutes that day. The unique five-gun bty was made up of a 6 pdr, manned by the Fort's Guard, a 9 pdr manned by 2 RCHA in full dress, a QF 25 pdr manned by the local Limber Gunners in Korea War period battle dress, a C3 howitzer manned by 7 Toronto and finally a M777 manned by 2 RCHA in CADPAT. It was a memorable event for Gunners and civilians alike.

The Regt had a Change of Command on 29 November from LCol Szabunio to LCol Ryan Smid. LCol Smid has been with the Regt for almost three years before taking command. Most recently he was the Regt's DCO and in both 2014 and 2015 he was the Bty Commander of 48 Bty at RST in Meaford.

The Regt also saw the posting of WO R. Morningstar, who had been with the Regt as the RSS Ops WO for almost 4 years. WO Morningstar remains in the area as he is taking SLT at CFB Borden. He will be missed, but the impact and mentorship he provided the junior leaders of the Regt will ensure his legacy remains. He was replaced by the very capable WO N. Sylvester,

who comes from 2 RCHA by way of the CF Recruiting Group. We look forward to the impact his vast expertise in the OP's will have on the Regt.

December 7, 2015 marked the handover of 9 Bty Command from Maj J. Dean to Capt M. Ortiz-Sosa. Maj Dean was appointed Bty Commander in May 2013. The Bty has undergone significant change over the last 2 ½ years. Originally a Gun and Mortar Bty, it now operates as an independent 105 mm C3 Howitzer Bty. Training culminated in March with Ex BLACK HAND, which saw the unit fire Regimentally in Meaford, ON. 9 Bty enjoys a healthy competition with 15 Bty in garrison as well as the field. This training year has seen a lot of success, including the completion of PWTs, IBTS Training, Parade of Remembrance up Yonge Street, Remembrance Day Salute, Gun Displays at the CF Staff College and Chanukah Festival, and of course Gunnery training in Meaford. 9 Bty soldiers remain in fierce competition for positions on the Basic Parachute Course, Ironman Competitions and the Niagara Marathon. 9 Bty currently has soldiers working in support of Op PROVISION with the Auxiliary Security Force in Trenton supporting the arrival of Syrian refugees. We are also fortunate to welcome Capt E. Leslie, coming from 30th Field. The Bty then busied itself with preparations for the Christmas season, and is looking to 2016 which will bring Basic Winter Warfare Training, more live fire exercises, and Ex BLACK HAND where we will welcome 56 Fd Regt to fire with us. Keep up the great work!

Meanwhile in 15 Bty, two members were deployed on Operations. Bdr Tenzin was handpicked for the DART response after

the earthquakes in Nepal and Bty Commander Maj S. Graham deployed in the fall as a Targeting Officer in the fight against ISIS.

15 Bty took the lead in organizing a running and marching team for the 32 CBG Niagara Ultra Marathon. Sgt A. Kase put together a team of soldiers from the Regt for this event. Keeping up the dismantled mortar spirit Sgt Kase also helped mentor the Regt's Army Ironman team alongside Capt E. McBride who was the Team Captain. Every team member completed the race in a respectable time. Additionally of note, the BSM WO T. Banksingh was selected as the RCA PRes Sgt of the Year.

Our bond with the Queen's Own Rifles of Canada has continued to grow as the Bty sent two members on their Jump Course this summer; Capt Laxton and Sgt Kase. Since becoming qualified both have been on jumps this fall.

Maj Graham shifted the bty's training from technical skills to dismantled tactics, which was displayed during FTX COUGAR SPIRIT in October. In Maj Graham's lieu, Maj N. Grewal has stepped in to fill the role of BC and since has seen the bty provide support to 56 Fd Regt during their dismantled mortar exercise, Ex AUTUMN MORTAR. A contingent of 8 soldiers took part, consisting of a complete Mortar Detachment, an OP Detachment Commander and Signaller, and a Recce Officer. Not only were we able to provide perspectives based on our

dismantled mortar experience but we were able to see how a different unit deploys in this capacity as well. It was a great training exercise and an opportunity to build combined training between our Regts.

The Regimental Band and 130 Training, HQ and Service Bty has been led by Capt M. Ortiz-Sosa for much of the past 2 years. The band performed their normal, busy and diverse musical performances across the Toronto area and sent many members to the Ceremonial Guard in Ottawa as well as the RCA Band in Edmonton. Also, bandsman MCpl K. Villar was able to top

the 2015 PLQ course at CFB Petawawa, a course run for all trades. 130 Bty ran an OP Detachment Member course in the spring as well as maintaining a Troop of BMQ soldiers and a Troop of pre-PLQ soldiers. 130 Bty also deployed one of its pers, MCpl Shvetsov on Op REASSURANCE.

Looking forward to 2016, the Regt will observe the 150th anniversary of the founding of a permanent Artillery presence in Toronto. We look to build our relationships with our Regtl family as well as other Artillery units within the Division and those manoeuvre elements in 32 CBG. We will be respecting old traditions and building new ones and, as always, remain Ubique.

The Guelph statue had the distinction of being unveiled by the Governor General, His Excellency the Right Honourable David Johnston, as well as the Colonel Commandant. In its 95th year of service to Canada and to Canadians, 15th Fd Artillery Regt, RCA had an excellent year of training, education, performance and community outreach. The year saw consistent continuity in individual and collective training. It was also a year where new Battery Commanders and a new Battery Sergeant-Major were introduced, members were decorated and one of its members deployed on Canada's mission to Nepal. The Regtl Band furthered its reputation as one of the very best military bands with musical performances that brought credit to both the CAF and the unit.

Commencing in January, dry practice training on the 81 mm Mortar began followed by small arms review; all leading to a mortar exercise in Washington State in late February. Given the unit's location in the heart of Vancouver, early in the year several fan-out drills simulating a major earthquake were conducted. The Lower Mainland of BC is considered a seismic prone area and as such, the 39 CBG's domestic operations scenarios are largely based on this premise. The unit conducts regular training on the use of power tools, rescue equipment, first aid and search and rescue techniques. A carpenter by trade, 2Lt I. Ocegüera taught lessons on the use of chainsaws, which the unit possesses along with other emergency equipment. At the end of April and into early May, 39 CBG conducted Ex DUCIMUS THUNDER at Yakima Training

Center in Washington. It was an opportunity to train a combined arms (Infantry and Artillery) team in the COE. The exercise provided unique and challenging training on select BTS at Level 3 to set the conditions for later success during Ex COUGAR DESTROYER and Ex WESTERN GUNNER. The primary focus of the year was Ex WESTERN GUNNER held in Shilo, MB, of which the Commanding Officer of 15 Fd Regt RCA, LCol Brent Purcell, acted as Exercise Director. The Regt provided the combined manning for three guns, a FOO and BC parties, and other elements for the exercise.

In the spring, an Airbrakes and a MSVS course were run followed by second serials of both in the fall in support of the Collective Individual Training Year (CITY) regimen that British Columbia units participate in. The unit also supported summer course tasks and sent students on a variety of Individual Training courses across Canada. Some members attended the LUSAR, CIMIC and other specialized courses which gave greater capability to the unit outside of its traditional role. Along with tactical and technical training, the Regt also performed the ceremonial gun salutes for Canada Day and Remembrance Day.

Following the devastating earthquake on 25 April, in Nepal, that killed over 9,000 people and injured more than 23,000, 2Lt R. Prasad answered the call for CAF members who could speak Nepalese and/or Hindi. After a quick DAG, he was deployed as



part of the DART on Op RENAISSANCE 15-1. While in Nepal, 2Lt Prasad experienced the second 7.3 magnitude quake that occurred on 12 May that followed the initial 7.8 magnitude quake.

As with previous years, several members were recognized for their performance. 2Lt R. Jones received the Lieutenant Bill Martyn Memorial Sword for the Subaltern of the Year. The Brigadier RT DuMoulin Trophy for the Most Efficient Member of the WOs' and Sgts' Mess went to Sgt C. Skuce. The British Columbia Ex-Artillery Sgt's Association award for the Most Proficient Detachment Commander went to Sergeant K. Keene. The Lieutenant Colonel Jackson Trophy for the Most Proficient Bombardier of the Year went to Bdr S. Weststeijn. The Most Proficient Corporal award was presented to MCpl M. Wong. The Gunner of the Year trophy, in memory of Gunner Douglas Corsor, Jr, went to Bdr M. Kwoun Kim and lastly, Pte J. Deacon received the British Columbia Ex-Artillery Sgt's Association award for being the Most Efficient Recruit.

31 Bty

Major I. Watt took over as Battery Commander of 31 Bty at the start of the summer and was joined by WO C. Roberts in the fall as he returned to the unit from 39 CBG HQ. Primarily a headquarters and holding bty for recruits, it has had a very full year of service and training. New recruits, Ptes with BMQ and Ptes with BMQ Land qualifications are continually in training while waiting for completion of DP1. Their training nights consist of lectures, drill and the preparation of kit in anticipation of their courses. They also partake in collective and individual training, and some Artillery training with 68 Bty when feasible. Upon completion of DP1, the new Gunners are transferred to 68 Bty.

68 Bty

Major A. Grieve assumed command of 68 Bty this year. The Bty can trace its lineage back to 68th Bty, Canadian Field Artillery (CFA) when it was a feeder Bty for Gunners heading for the battlefields of Europe in World War I. 68th Bty CFA was later reformed in England and took part in the North Russia Expeditionary Force 1918-1919. With this proud history, 68 Bty today is the Field Artillery bty of the Regt and has four 105 mm Howitzer C3s and two 81 mm Mortars.

Ex ARCHANGEL GUNNER was held at Chilliwack, BC from 23-25 January and concentrated on the Basic Cold Weather Training required for an Artillery Regt to deploy, move, patrol, observe and conduct area reconnaissance in basic winter conditions. Later, the Regt attended Ex CAUSTIC SHOCK from 20-22 February at Yakima Training Center (YTC), Washington. It was a Bty level training exercise that included the deployment, reconnaissance and local defense of an Artillery Sub-Unit firing mortars. The aforementioned Ex DUCIMUS THUNDER and Ex WESTERN GUNNER were both held successfully in the spring and summer. Ex DAMAGED GUNNER, held in October, was a domestic operations exercise. The context of the training was for the unit to exercise its contingency planning, rapid reaction and urban ops skills in order to enhance preparedness for future do-

mestic operations.

15 Fd Regt RCA Band

The 15th Fd Artillery Regt Band participated in many military and public engagements. The Band provided solo trumpeters on 22 occasions during the week leading up to 11 November, two Victory in Europe Day ceremonies in May, and five military funerals during the year. The Band was televised in its performances of the national anthem at a Vancouver Canucks game, a BC Lions game, and at the Davis Cup tennis championship. The Band also provided musical support for the BC Army Gala dinner, the ANZAC 100th Anniversary parade, the 39 CBG Change of Command parade, the Battle of Britain parade, and the 15th Fd Artillery Regt's Canada Day and Remembrance Day gun salutes. The Band sent several members to participate with other military musicians from the US Armed Forces and from the Naden Band of the RCN in the annual International Military Band Concert held in Victoria. The Band participated in the Okanagan Military Tattoo in Vernon in July, and also performed with the Vancouver Welsh Men's Choir in its annual With Glowing Hearts Remembrance Day concerts. There were many other public performances during the year in and around the Lower Mainland. But, just in case that all was not quite enough to keep everyone busy, the Band also participated in the annual Vancouver Santa Claus parade. All in all, another busy year for the Regt Band.

Affiliated Cadet Units

The 2472 RCACC (15th Fd Artillery Regt, RCA Cadet Corps) and 111 Pegasus RCAC (Royal Canadian Air Cadets) Sqn are housed and affiliated with the Regt. Both Cadet units had an active training year consisting of citizenship and training both locally and in other parts of Canada.

2015 has been an incredibly busy and successful year for 111 Pegasus Sqn. In February, they hosted their annual spring tag days. Tag days

are crucial to the running of any sqn, as they are the main source of revenue for the entire training year. At 111, they have two tag day weekends per year, one in the winter and one in the spring. They also held their annual Effective Speaking team competition. In Effective Speaking, cadets prepare and deliver speeches to a panel of judges, and are marked on their delivery and content. April was another busy month for them, as they competed in the Lower Mainland drill team, first aid team, and band competitions. The drill team competition involves a team of 15 cadets executing a series of complex drill movements, in which they are marked on their execution, dress, and deportment throughout the day. The first aid team involves a team of cadets who perform a simulated first aid rescue scenario, and are marked on their ability to diagnose and treat medical complications. Finally, the band competition involves all members of the Sqn Band performing a memorized drill routine while simultaneously playing music. During the final weeks of the training year, they also participated in numerous gliding days in which they are given opportunity to try their hand at flying the Schweizer SGS 2-33 glider used in the Air

Cadet program, under the supervision of an experienced pilot. Finally, the training year culminated in their 76th Annual Ceremonial Review and awards dinner. This involves the cadets performing a parade in which they display the knowledge they have gained over the training year and includes performances by the drill team and band. Additionally, it is an opportunity for outstanding cadets to be recognized for their performance over the training year with more awards being presented at the awards dinner.

At the start of the new training year, the sqn had a change of command, in which Captain A. Smith took over from Major D. Timms. This was an exciting opportunity for everyone, as Major Timms moved on to command another sqn, and 111 received the new perspectives and experiences that come with a change of leadership. They also participated in a parade commemorating the Battle of Britain, and helped the Royal Canadian Legion Poppy Drive. The sqn participated at Crab Park with 15 Fd Regt RCA and 2742 RCACC on Remembrance Day. As the training year has only recently started, there have been no competitions yet, but 111 RCACS will field, as in the past, a drill team, first aid team, effective speaking team, and a band. Before winter break, they

will be hosting their Annual Christmas Potluck, in which cadets are encouraged to bring food from home to share with the rest of the sqn and celebrate the holiday season. Lastly they are preparing for FTX HOATH, a Winter Field Training Exercise at Manning Park in January.

During the renovation of the Seaforth Armoury, Bessborough Armoury has become the temporary home of the 135 Bell Irving Air Cadet Squadron and the 72 Royal Canadian Army Cadet Corps. The Armoury has also been a venue for The Seaforth Highlanders of Canada holding their annual association dinner in our historic building rather than the Brigade Headquarters where the unit is currently based.

As 2015 came to an end, 15th Fd Artillery Regt, RCA looked forward to 2016 and to the Regt's 96th Birthday on 2 February. The members of the unit are committed to continued service to Canada, and to maintain their preparedness for both domestic and international operations. They look forward to the future but reflect on the work and service done in the past as they continue to work to represent the highest standards of the CAF, the CA, and The RCA.

30th Fd Artillery Regt, RCA had a big year in 2015. Manning a bty of 105 mm C3s in support of 33 CBG and providing a HQ element to 33 Territorial Brigade Group remains the Regt's primary function. With the addition of a STA capability the Regt is growing to over one hundred and forty all ranks. As the National Salute Troop, the Regt provided salutes on Parliament Hill and around the National Capital Region on numerous occasions, including the opening of Parliament and providing the Army Run starter-gun. 2 Bty had a change of command and participated in a plethora of 33 CBG and Regtl exercises. 1 Bty was once again stood up after being stood down in 2014. A detachment was sent to Fort Wellington to participate in Parks Canada's commemoration of the Canadian efforts against the Fenian's in 1866 to 1871. Morrison Artillery Park (MAP) is becoming the go to place for Gunners in Ottawa with the gun park hosting The RCA Senate and several other high level RCA events yearly.

2 Bty

2 Bty began 2015 with Ex POLAR DEFENDR, a mortar exercise with two training objectives. The first was the ability to layer fires of mortars and C6 machine guns in the sustained fire role. The second was to have members of the Cameron Highland-

ers conduct All Arms Call For Fire (AACFF). Both objectives were achieved successfully, bringing another level of understanding in a combined arms battle.

In March, 2 Bty combined their efforts with 42nd Fd Regt and 49th Fd Regt to form a combined Regt minus. This consisted of a Mortar Bty formed to complete the confirmation shoot for an 81mm Mortar course and a second Bty composed of howitzers. The training objective for the howitzers was to complete a fire plan with

PYSOPS being employed as an element in the fire plan. The fire plan first had the Tactical PYSOPS Team (TPT) integrated. Following this the Bty engaged targets followed by the TPT finishing with surrender messaging and surrender directives. The work up this fire plan consisted of a series of voice procedure exercises requiring the FOO to be able to modify the fire plan on fires and combat team net.

In August, 2 Bty split into two entities for 4th Canadian Division's Ex STALWART GUARDIAN 15. At the ATG level we had a blend of Regulars and Reserves providing FOO, STA and FSCC support. The gun line participated in a series of training events including preparing a planned defensible position with gun pits, a mortar raid delivered by both Chinook and assault boats, and Regtl fire planning. For his outstanding performance as an OP Det Commander, MBdr Dent was awarded a 2 RCHA CO's coin.



Command of 2 Bty changed hands in September from Capt D Montague to Maj M. Koshman. Ex DELTOID FLEX, taking place in October, consisted of quick actions, GPO's open actions, smoke withdrawals, and concluded with a fire plan that was adjusted and completed through the use of infrared and thermal optics. The Bty was pleased to host three former members for their last rounds; LCol Dana Clarke, Maj Paul Heenan and Maj Pierre Lepine all started out in 30 RCA in the 1970s and will all be retired by the time this article is published. Good shooting, gents. End of Mission!

November's Ex AUTUMN LANCE brought more AACFF with the Cameron Highlanders and the Ontario Regt, RCAC, calling for fire via a combat team net. This exercise also had the gun det commanders carry out sniping gun tasks. We also took the opportunity to say farewell to our former BC as Capt D. Montague fired his last round with us. Well done, Master Gunner! Enjoy your retirement.

1 Bty

Capt C. Brown took command from Capt D. Atkins who is off on the Army Operations Course. Amongst its many tasks, 1 Bty prepares recruits to attend their basic training and Artillery DP1. 1 Bty did what it does best and produced (yet another) Artillery NCM Top Candidate from 30th Field Regiment, Gunner Riley Courtland.

1 Bty was also at the forefront of demonstrating the crucial importance of the Artillery to 33 CBG CIMIC and IA training by providing a Targeting Cell. Working with CIMIC and IA operators from 33 CBG IA Coy, 1 Bty's Targeting Cell conducted training which consisted of creating targeting folders based on personnel, structure, and belief targets; using both lethal and non-lethal effects; and the preparation of targeting boards.

Heritage Troop

In September, the Regt formalized its restoration and commemorative program by standing up its new Heritage Troop.

The troop is comprised of serving Gunners and other members of the Regt family including volunteers and retired members. It is tasked with restoring and conserving the Regt's growing collection of historic guns. Working with the Bytown Gunners Firepower Museum, they will support the Regt's ceremonial duties by engaging Canadians with displays and demonstrations of its historic guns at commemorative and ceremonial events throughout the National Capital Region and beyond.

This year the Regt reached the final stages in its restoration of its Second World War era 17 pdr Anti-Tank gun. Produced in 1945, the gun was used as a monument in Carleton Place, and finally ended up in a local farmer's field, from which it was acquired by the Regt in 2013. It has been painstakingly restored and was first displayed during the Ottawa Tulip Festival in May. Once complete, it will be used to commemorate one of our antecedent units, the 1st Anti-Tank Regt, RCA. In addition to ongoing restorations, efforts in 2016 will focus on standing up a det capable of operating the 17 pdr gun, as well as a det for the Regt's 1870 9 pdr Rifled Muzzle-Loading gun.

The Bytown Gunners Firepower Museum

The Bytown Gunners Firepower Museum had its grand opening in May. Since then, museum volunteers have given more than four thousand hours to grow and maintain the artefacts. The museum created a technical museum library and indexing system where historical "equipment reference books" are catalogued, retained, controlled and loaned out through volunteers. The museum has made a number of acquisitions of actual field Artillery pieces and equipment including (but certainly not limited to):

- a 155 mm Howitzer;
- a 40 mm Bofors AA Gun (on loan from 42nd Fd Regt);
- a 1950's era M135 2 ½ Ton Truck;
- another 9 Pdr RML gun (on loan from the Canadian War Museum);
- the famous "Noon Day" Parliament Hill cannon; and

-an L-5 Pack Howitzer which was fired as part of the Remembrance Day ceremonies at the National Military Cemetery and the National Artillery Monument in Ottawa.

The number of visits to the Bytown Gunners Firepower Museum has surpassed expectations. Since its grand opening, it has hosted Scouts groups, high school students, local Cadet Corps, and roughly five hundred other local visitors.

Cadets

The Regiment is affiliated to two cadet corps: 2317-30th Fd Regt, RCA Cadet Corps at MAP, and 2958- 1st Anti-Tank Regiment, RCA Cadet Corps at the Legion in Manotick.

30 Fd RCA Cdt Corps

2015 was a very busy year for the Corps, with many changes at the senior levels. Capt S. Hodder took command from Capt C. Moynahan. Cadet CWO K. Clairoux took over Cadet RSM duties from outgoing Cadet CWO C. Langevin, and Cadet MWO A. Binda took over the position of Cadet BSM from Cadet MWO K. Damphousse.

Field exercises saw our cadets learning winter and wilderness survival skills, including sleeping in improvised shelters and abseiling down a vertical rock face. In the fall, they travelled to CFB Trenton where they practiced their abseil and rappelling skills on vertical surfaces and from a mock helicopter. Ongoing week-end marksmanship training indoctrinated cadets in safe firearms handling and helped to develop their skills and accuracy.

30 RCA cadets competed in the Canadian Cadet Organization's winter biathlon program, with individual cadets advancing to regional competition. The cadets were active in the Ot-

2015 a été une année chargée pour le 62^e Régt d'artillerie de campagne et l'année 2016 s'annonce tout aussi riche en défis pour nos artilleurs. Durant les premiers mois de l'année, des exercices concernant les habiletés hivernales ont été conduits dans les secteurs hors base.

Du 23 au 25 octobre, le 62^e Régt d'artillerie de campagne a fait sa marque auprès des em-

Il n'est pas peu dire que tous ont été tirés hors de leur zone de confort lors de l'ex du 27 au 29 novembre. Cet ex a été conduit en collaboration avec le 6e RAC, le 2d Fd ainsi que le 5e Rég. En tout, le 62e RAC a tiré 200 obus. Tous les artilleurs ont reçu un défi de taille. Bien que conduites pendant 48 heures seulement, les opérations ont été menées à un tempo élevé. La troupe a conduit entre autres un mouvement routier de nuit qui a duré près d'une heure et demie, mettant à l'épreuve les habiletés des chauffeurs et des commandants de détachement. Plusieurs autres cours sont à l'horaire du régt, dont membre du détachement d'observation et superviseur technique du secteur des pièces

Les 7 et 8 novembre, les militaires du 62e RAC ont bravé la température pour commémorer la perte de nos héros nationaux devant les cénotaphes de Victoriaville et de Shawinigan. En effet, le 7 novembre avait lieu la parade à Victoriaville en collaboration avec la Légion filiale 86, les corps de cadets de la ville et environs, des membres de la GRC ainsi que divers corps policiers de la région des Bois- Francs. Le tout a été conclu par une invitation de la part de la Légion au Lcol Roux, à l'Adjum Chevalier ainsi qu'au Capt Théberge. Ce dernier, originaire de

Victoriaville, a reçu le titre honorifique de vétéran de l'année. Rappelons-nous que le Capt Théberge a été déployé en Afghanistan en 2011. C'est avec un grand honneur que la Légion canadienne lui a fait cette invitation.

Le 8 novembre, ce fut au tour de Shawinigan de se recueillir. Suite à la traditionnelle parade au centre-ville de Shawinigan, les amis du régiment ont été invités pour le traditionnel buffet. Puis, ce fut au tour des joueurs de hockey des Cataractes de Shawinigan et leurs partisans de se recueillir en mémoire des soldats disparus lors d'un match de la LHJMQ. La cérémonie a débuté par une mise au jeu protocolaire avec le commandant du régt, l'écrivain et éditeur Bryan Perro et quelques vétérans. Le tout a été suivi par l'interprétation de l'hymne national par la musique du régiment.

Le régt a été l'hôte le 5 décembre du traditionnel dîner ré- gimentaire de la Sainte-Barbe. Des officiers des quatre régi-

Enfin, soulignons le départ de deux piliers de la troupe du régt. Le Bdr Annie Garceau et le Bdr François Gagnon quittent le 62 RAC après plus de 25 années de services. Leur présence a toujours été appréciée des jeunes artilleurs. Bonne chance dans leurs projets futurs UBIQUE !

2015 was a year of growth for the 20th Independent Field Battery. At the beginning of the year, the unit had 63 active members, with 65% attendance rates on regular parade nights. By the end of the year, the unit grew to 69 active members with a 90% attendance rates on regular parade nights. The unit successfully enrolled new soldiers and Officers with seven new Privates complet-

ing BMQ and two new Officer Cadets completing BMOQ. Ten newly qualified DP1 NCMs returned from summer training, nine of whom were promoted to Gunner. The unit qualified two Recce Techs and two CP Techs bringing the unit closer to its goal of fielding a complete Battery. Several members completed PLQ with Bombardiers Ames, Merrick and Pickerell being promoted to Master Bombardier. Lt Bittman and Capt Mein completed their FOO course and became the unit's first FOOs since the Battery officially re-rolled in 2011 from Air Defence.

The battery took part in the 3 Division Artillery concentration, Ex WESTERN GUNNER 15, and was one of the largest troop contributing units to the exercise. Immediately following this concentration in August, a FOO party participated in Ex WESTERN DEFENDER 15 and Ex GALLANT CITIZEN providing Artillery advice to the supported arms. September training focused on

IBTS training and began with Ex MUSKET GUNNER, where the unit re-qualified on C-7 rifles. Ex SHAKY GUNNER, in October, refreshed the troops' dismounted mortar, ETHAR and patrolling skills and with support from 20th Fd Regt, the unit provided a firing troop to Ex MAPLE STRIKE 1502. Ex EASY GUNNER, held

MBdr Merrick participated in the 3rd Cdn Div CAFSAC team with the team winning the Clarence B. Smith award for the best overall Reserve team in Canada.

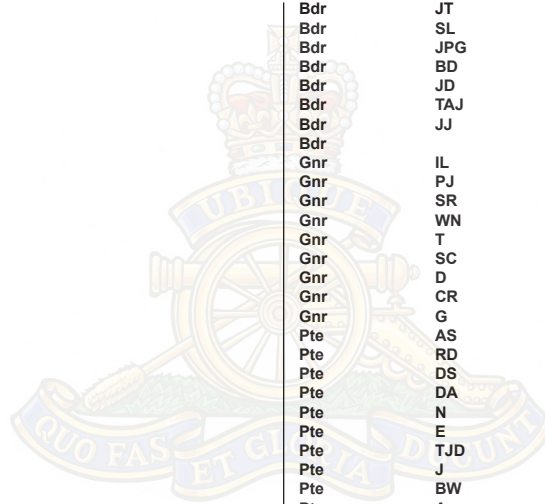

The RCA Band had an extremely busy and successful year, reaching out to communities in Edmonton and across Canada by performing at street parades, festivals, stampedes, ceremonies, and public concerts.

The musicians of the RCA Band continued their annual participation in the Calgary Stampede parade and Spruce Meadows in Calgary, Victoria Day celebrations and Canada Day events at the AB Legislature, and numerous Change of Command ceremonies at 3rd Canadian Division Support Base Edmonton. They were invited back to perform the halftime show at the Edmonton Eskimos game on August 28th, as part of Military Appreciation Night. The RCA Band was also proud to continue "A Musical Salute: A Tribute to Our Veterans" at Edmonton City Hall, a celebratory concert held prior to Remembrance Day.

The RCA Band continued their highly successful Educational School Concert Series (ESCS) in the spring. The ESCS is geared towards students in grades 4-6, and is intended to explore various instruments and styles of music through educational and popular selections. Since the series launch in 2013, the RCA Band has performed for over 4000 students from Edmonton and neighboring communities.

Throughout the year, the small ensembles of the RCA Band have been performing noon hour concerts at City Room in Ed-



monton City Hall. Once a month the public can be treated to a varied program by one of the RCA Band's many groups. The repertoire, which on any concert could include Celtic music, jazz, classical, or pop, is varied in style and there is something for everyone.

From February 19-23 the RCA Band Soul Orchestra travelled to Whitehorse for the annual Sourdough Rendezvous Festival,

where they performed 3 shows held in a large tent on the festival site. They performed music by Funk legend James Brown, the great American pianist, bandleader and composer Herbie Hancock, and Afrobeat pioneer Fela Kuti. They also played with the iconic Canadian children's music performer Fred Penner.

A highlight for many musicians in the unit was Ex AGORA ELWOOD, completed in April. This involved travelling to Resolute, Nunavut, a town of just over 200 in the high Arctic. The RCA Band was invited by Major S. Wright, Director of the CAF Arctic Training Centre. The exercise focused on winter training and community relations. The RCA Band performed a concert at the Polar Continental Shelf Program facility, two school concerts, and one evening concert at Resolute City Hall. The programs focused on introducing students to modern and traditional military band instruments through a variety of musical styles. The RCA Band also returned to Vernon, BC, to participate in the Okanagan Military Tattoo. While there they worked with cadets at the Vernon Army Cadet Summer Training Centre. RCA Band Musicians led masterclasses, which are essentially group lessons, had a side-by-side rehearsal with the cadets, and performed a concert featuring their small ensembles.

This year the RCA Band said goodbye to Band SM, MWO Curtis Bain, who was posted to the Central Band of the CAF in Ottawa. They welcomed MWO Daniel Keels, posted to Edmonton from the Royal 22è Rég't Band in Québec City.

The musicians of the RCA Band would also like to send out a special thanks to all the reservists who were able to join them and help make this year so successful.

The RCA Band has a long tradition of providing musical support to the CAF. They have been based in Edmonton since 1997, but their existence can be traced back to the end of the 19th century. It is one of six Regular Force bands stationed throughout



Canada, with a complement of 35 full-time musicians. From military parades, ceremonial occasions, and government functions, to formal concerts and entertaining their fellow soldiers, the RCA Band can be heard performing in a variety of musical styles nationally and abroad. The issue of membership and staffing of the committees is the number one task for the RCAA in 2016.

The highlight of the year was the unveiling in Ottawa of the statue of Lt Col John McCrae on 3 May 2015, one hundred years after he penned the iconic poem In Flanders Fields. The statue is located adjacent to the Artillery Memorial on Green Island. Some 600 seated guests were on hand to watch The Honorable Pierre Poilievre unveil the statue. On the previous evening a mixed guest night for 237, including 43 VIPs and donors, was held at the Canadian Museum of History hosted jointly by the RCA and the RCMS.

The RCAA held its Annual General Meeting and Seminar in Ottawa, 11-12 September 2015. The theme for the Seminar was "Sustaining the Relevance of The Royal Regiment of Canadian Artillery – The Strategic Campaign Plan and Family Strategy". The aim of the Strategic Campaign plan is the identification and prioritization of capabilities that will ensure the RCA is relevant, employed and valued by the Canadian Army 2020 – 2035. The identified priorities focus on Ground-Based Air Defence, beyond line-of-sight surveillance and target acquisition, long range 24/7 precision strike and digitization of Artillery command and control. The family strategy session focused on exploitation of the internet to improve communications within the greater artillery family.

The AGM was held on the second day with the traditional mess dinner the previous evening. Due to travel restrictions resulting from the election process attendance at the dinner was limited to 100 members and guests. The AGM and Seminar for 2016 will be held 21-22 October 2016 at 30 Fd Regt's Morrison Artillery Park in Ottawa.

The most significant outcome of the AGM and Seminar was the inauguration of the RCAA News Briefs, an e-newsletter delivered weekly to subscribers with current news stories, Gunner news and notice of deceased Gunners.

La statue est située près du Monument commémoratif de l'Artillerie canadienne sur l'île Verte. Quelque 600 invités étaient présents pour regarder l'honorable Pierre Poilievre dévoiler la statue. La veille, 237 invités, y compris 43 dignitaires et donateurs, ont participé à une soirée spéciale tenue par l'ARC et le SSRC au Musée canadien de l'histoire.

L'AARC a tenu son assemblée générale et son séminaire annuels à Ottawa, les 11 et 12 septembre 2015. Le thème du séminaire était « Maintenir la pertinence du Régiment royal de l'Artillerie canadienne – Plan de campagne stratégique et stratégie pour la famille ». Le plan de campagne stratégique vise à établir et à classer par ordre de priorité les capacités qui assureront la pertinence de l'ARC et qui garantiront son emploi et son appréciation par l'Armée canadienne (2020 – 2035). Les priorités établies sont axées sur la défense aérienne basée au sol, la surveillance et l'acquisition de cibles au-delà de la portée optique, les frappes de précision à longue portée pouvant être utilisées à tous moments et la numérisation du commandement et contrôle de l'artillerie. La séance sur la stratégie pour la famille a mis l'accent sur l'exploitation de l'Internet afin d'améliorer la communication au sein de la grande famille de l'artillerie.

L'AGA a eu lieu le deuxième jour, et le dîner régimentaire traditionnel s'est déroulé le soir précédent. En raison de restrictions concernant les voyages entraînées par le processus électoral, le nombre de participants a été limité à 100. L'AGA et le séminaire de 2016 auront lieu les 21 et 22 octobre 2016 au parc d'artillerie Morrison du 30 RAC, à Ottawa.

Le résultat le plus significatif de l'AGA et du séminaire a été la mise en œuvre des Actualités en bref de l'AARC, un bulletin électronique hebdomadaire contenant des reportages, des nouvelles sur les artilleurs et des avis de décès d'artilleurs.

The RCA Museum - Musée de l'ARC

In 2015, The RCA Museum went on the road to many communities across Manitoba, bringing the Artillery story and our collection to over 45,000 people. The Museum brought guns, vehicles and historical displays to many community events, such as Heritage Days at the Manitoba Museum in Winnipeg, Threshermen's Days at the Manitoba Agricultural Museum in Austin, Parks Canada's wartime event "We'll Meet Again" at Lower Fort Garry, the Brandon Air Show at the Commonwealth



Air Training Plan Museum, and to a number of community parades.

In June 2015, the temporary exhibit *The Great War: 1914-1915* closed after a very successful run since August 2014. This interactive exhibit examined the outbreak of the First World War and its effects on Canada with a focus on how soldiers were recruited and trained as well as their first experiences in battle. It was exceptionally popular with school groups. Due to this heightened demand public tours of the museum were up 26% over 2015. The next WW1 exhibit will be *The Somme: The Mechanization of War* and will open 1 July 2016.

In July 2015, the museum hosted participants from the Brandon Open Doors event, during which our vehicle storage space at M101 opened to the public for the first time. Visitors were awed by the scope of the museum's vehicle and gun collection as well as the workshop and equipment available to museum staff to care for and restore.

The museum's next temporary exhibit, *The Airborne Gunner*, was developed with and supported by donations from the Retired Airborne Gunners Association. The exhibit featured uniforms, parachute gear, and specially designed equipment from WW2 through to peacekeeping operations in the 1970's, much of it on loan from members of the association. Included in the exhibit was a Jeep used by the Airborne that was commonly airdropped during training exercises. This exhibit closed at the end of November 2015.

The next temporary exhibit will be *Designed for Victory: Women, War and the Vote* recognizing women's support of the war effort through the 20th century as well as commemorating 100

En 2015, le Musée de l'ARC s'est lancé sur les routes pour visiter de nombreuses collectivités dans l'ensemble du Manitoba, amenant l'histoire de l'Artillerie et notre collection à plus de 45 000 personnes. Le Musée a apporté des armes, des véhicules et des expositions historiques à de nombreux événements communautaires, comme les journées du patrimoine au musée de l'agriculture du Manitoba à Austin, l'activité spéciale Nous nous rever-

rons de Parcs Canada à Lower Fort Garry, le Festival aérien de Brandon au Commonwealth Air Training Plan Museum, et de nombreux défilés communautaires.

En juin 2015, l'exposition temporaire *La Grande Guerre : 1914-1915* a pris fin après avoir eu beaucoup de succès depuis août 2014. Cette exposition interactive examinait le déclenchement de la Première Guerre mondiale et ses effets sur le Canada, en se concentrant sur la façon dont les soldats étaient recrutés et entraînés, ainsi que leurs premières expériences au combat. 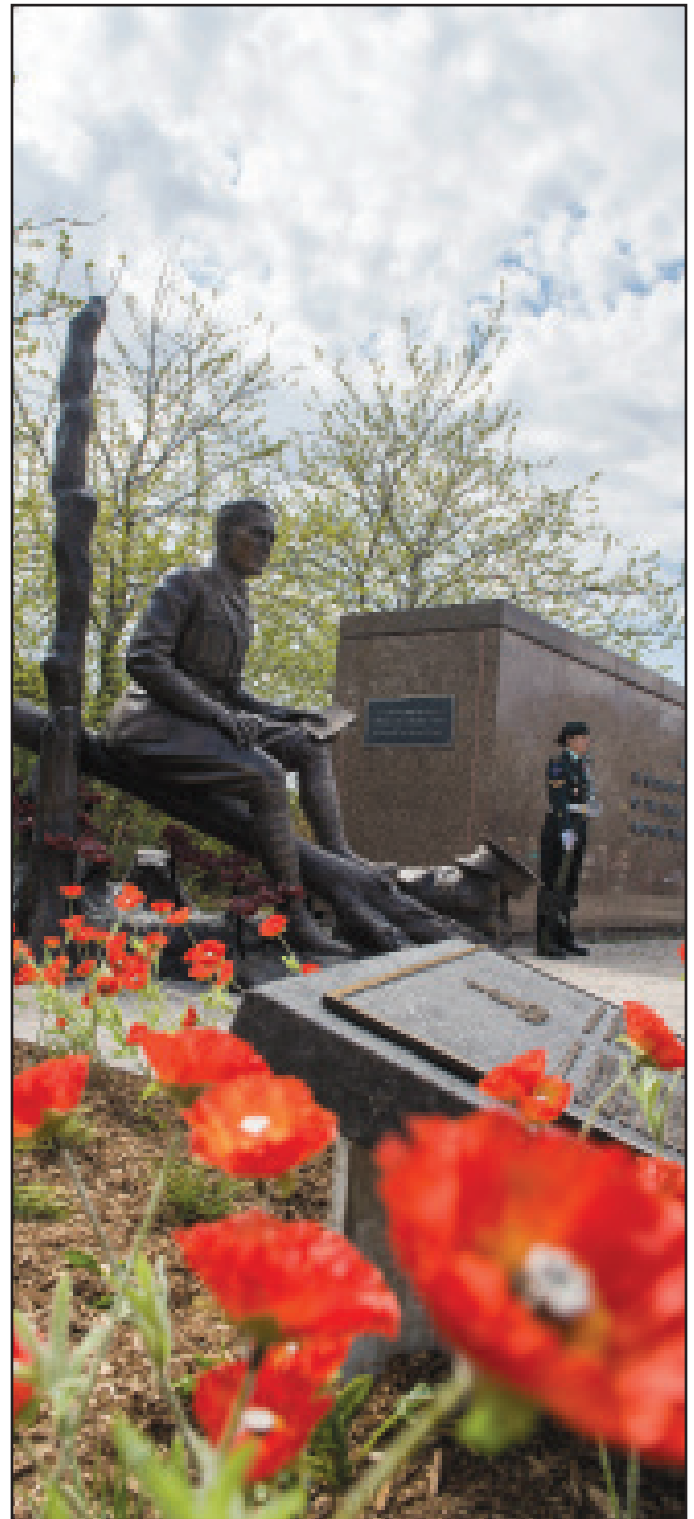
